thiopian Airlines "believes in" Boeing despite the crash of its 737 MAX 8 plane that killed all 157 people on board and led to the model's grounding, the carrier's CEO said on Monday.

"Let me be clear: Ethiopian Airlines believes in Boeing. They have been a partner of ours for many years," TewoldeGebreMariam wrote in a statement.

"We will work with investigators in Ethiopia, in the US and elsewhere to figure out what went wrong," he added.

Flight ET 302 crashed on March 10 just minutes into its flight to Nairobi.

It was the second disaster for the 737 MAX 8 since the October crash of an Indonesian Lion Air Jet that killed all 189 passengers and crew. Aviation regulators responded by grounding the model around the world.

Ethiopia's transport minister has said "clear

Tewolde announced on Saturday the airline would sue both publications for "publishing baseless defamatory stories", according to Ethiopia's stateCorporate.

Ethiopian Airlines is Africa's largest carrier and has had a long association with American aviation.

Founded in 1945 with assistance from former American carrier Trans World Airlines (TWA), Boeing aircraft make up the majority of the Ethiopian fleet.

Tewolde called for the 737 MAX 8's grounding after the crash, but in the statement struck a conciliatory tone towards Boeing.

"Despite the tragedy, Boeing and Ethiopian Airlines will continue to be linked well into the future," he said.-AFP


epidemic has now exceeded 1,000 cases, the Health Ministry said on Monday, with a death toll of 629 in the world's second worst ever outbreak.

Health workers have been

this latest epidemic of the hemorrhagic fever, which causes severe vomiting, diarrhea and bleeding, and kills more than half those it infects. New technologies like a trial vaccine, experimental

treatments and futuristic cube-shaped mobile units for treating patients have helped curb the spread of the virus.

But public mistrust and rampant insecurity in the parts of eastern Democratic Republic of Congo where Ebola has struck have hampered the response, complicating the fight against it.



Five Ebola centers have been attacked since last month, sometimes by armed assailants. The violence led French medical charity Medecins Sans Frontieres (MSF) to suspend its activities at the epicenter of the outbreak last month.

As a result, it is now the second-deadliest in history. behind the 2013-16 one in West Africa that is believed to have killed more than 11,000 people.

"The total is now 1,009 cases," the ministry said in a statement, but it added: "the response, led by the Health Ministry in collaboration with its partners, has limited the geographical spread."-Reuters

EDITORIAI Echo from the Blue Oceans Conference

RESOLUTION FROM THE just-ended Blue Oceans Conference held in Liberia calls on governments around the world, including international partners to enhance sustainable fisheries management through science-based management measures, such as ecosystem-based approach by monitoring, control, and surveillance, as well as strengthening cooperation through regional fisheries management organizations and regional fishery bodies.

THE RESOLUTION CALLS upon all stakeholders, including the Economic Community of West Africa States (ECOWAS), the African Union (AU), the European Union (EU) and regional governments to continue efforts in supporting implementation of Sustainable Development Goal 14, in the context of the 2050 Africa's Integrated Maritime Strategy (AIMS) and the UN 2030 Agenda.

THE RECOMMENDATIONS ARE contained in an official resolution of the Blue Oceans Conference which convened from March 18 -21 at the Millennium Guest House in Congo Town, suburb of Monrovia.

THE CONFERENCE RESOLUTION could not have come at any better time than just as Liberia is negotiating a fishing agreement with the Republic of Senegal for 300 Senegalese vessels, including 200 semi-industrial and 100 artisan canoes to fish in our waters in exchange for training of Liberian fishermen.

ORDINARY LIBERIANS ARE jittery about the deal. They are not biting their tongues in expressing so, for an agreement that is geared at having foreigners exploit our waters with exclusive right to fish just about anything deep in our ocean.

THEIR CONCERNS ARE genuine especially, so when Senegal has a bad history of depleting its own waters of marine life; and is now turning to a vulnerable and less sophisticated country such as Liberia for a vital nature endowment.

FISHES ARE AMONG some of the healthiest foods on the planet. They are loaded with important nutrients, such as protein and vitamin D, and are also the world's best source of omega-3 fatty acids, which are incredibly important for the development of the human body and brain.

LAST MONTH, THE House of Representatives mandated the National Fisheries and Aquaculture Authority or NaFAA to negotiate protocol on the implementation of the Agreement on Fisheries and Aquaculture Cooperation between the Government of Liberia and the Government of Senegal. Negotiation between the two countries may just be ongoing and could well be at its advanced stage.

BUT RECOMMENDATIONS FROM the Blue Oceans Conference identify various flashpoint areas, clearly indicating there are still much work to do in Liberia before finalizing such fishing agreement, as delegates call for strengthening capacity building and technical assistance to small-scale fishers, to improve their access to marine resources and markets as well as improve socioeconomic situation of fisher folks, their families and communities and ensure that any future fishing agreements with external countries or other parties are grounded in science-based approaches to secure sustainability of fish stocks and prioritize the equitable distribution of benefits between countries and stakeholder groups.

Truly Taking Back Control

HICAGO - Britain is teetering toward Brexit. No one knows what will happen over the next few months. Yet around one-third of British voters support a "no-deal" departure from the European Union, which risks inflicting an economic disaster on the country.

Many of these "no-deal" Brexit supporters are older and modestly educated, and live in economically depressed semi-urban communities and small towns, which tend to be concentrated in northern England. Although they are anxious about the steady deterioration in their economic prospects, studies suggest that trade or even immigration are not their only concerns. Brexiteers also resent their loss of control over policy, first to a distant national capital full of well-educated global elites, and in recent years to an even more remote EU.

EU-mandated immigration rules are just the most obvious sign of their powerlessness. Brexit supporters voted to leave the EU in order to "take back control." Unfortunately, Brexit, in whatever form it takes, may not give them what they want, fueling further resentment. Can anything be done to quell their anger?

The disempowerment of communities is not a uniquely British phenomenon. As markets expand across political borders, participants prefer a common governance structure that eliminates annoying regulatory differences and transaction costs. Historically, such integration happened within countries. As inter-regional trade and capital flows increased, demands for seamless regional borders and harmonized national regulation became louder. National governments therefore increased their powers and functions at the expense of regions and local communities.

In turn, as globalization accelerated in recent decades, national governments acceded to international agreements and treaties that limited their sovereign powers. They have also ceded some powers to international bodies. For example, the European Commission's harmonization of economic regulations across the EU limits the regulatory discretion of individual member states. This has catalyzed movements seeking to reclaim national sovereignty, like that of the Brexiteers.

But even as power (and often funding) has moved from local to national and then international level, the effects of globalized markets and technological change have varied greatly. Strikingly, mega-cities have prospered while semi-rural communities have experienced diminishing economic activity and opportunity. The Great Recession that began in 2008 accentuated this trend, with cities bouncing back quickly while semi-rural areas languished. Such an uneven impact calls for responses that are suited to local needs and conditions. But formulating these responses is much harder when communities are disempowered.

Disempowerment causes further collateral damage. When opportunity leaves economically marginal communities, despair and social dysfunction typically set in. The number of broken families increases, as do rates of substance abuse and crime. Those who can leave move away. Far from being a source of pride and social cohesion, the community becomes a repository of collective sorrow, if not shame. And its members look to alternative sources of identity and social solidarity, including nationalism.

Populist nationalist leaders pledge to make their country "great again" by ridding it of the constraints imposed by international agreements and bodies. Of course, as they grab power back from the international arena, such leaders are tempted to resist the further devolution of power and funding to regions and communities. Instead, populist nationalists could turn more dangerously against the international system, presenting their supporters with a continuous parade of external villains to blame for their plight. This is a path that leads nowhere good.

To be sure, there are numerous other types of nationalism; many Brexiteers want Britain to remain open to trade while severely restricting immigration, for example. But as growth slows and their populations age, developed countries will need both export markets and some immigration - the first to support demand, and the second to pay for the pensions and health care of aging populations. Balkanizing the world by erecting barriers is a sure way to convert unequal prosperity today into collective poverty tomorrow.

The Fed Board Unmoored

According to Moore, who is not a professional economist, investors had "become hyper-dependent" on the Fed's "zero-interest-rate policy ... just as an addict craves crack cocaine." This "money creation," he surmised, had yielded "nada" in terms of "helping juice the economy, creating jobs, or giving the American worker a pay raise." Worse, the United States had already "tried this before - twice - and both times the story ended badly with a pop of the bubble ... in 1999-2000 and ... in 2008-09." The lesson, he concluded, is that, "Micromanaging the economy through the lever of money creation at the grand fiefdom within the Fed doesn't work."

Or does it? Moore himself is probably not the most reliable judge. On December 26, 2018, he savagely attacked Yellen's successor, Jerome Powell, for raising interest rates to unwind the very approach that he had condemned three years earlier. "If you cut engine power too far on a jetliner," he warned, "it will stall and drop out of the sky." Moore complained that after having "risen by 382 points on hopes that the Fed would listen to Trump and stop cutting power," the Dow Jones Industrial Average had "plunged by 895 points" on the news of another interest-rate hike. This, he concluded, was evidence that "the Fed's monetary policy has come unhinged."

Moore called on Powell to "do the honorable thing ... and resign." But, failing that, he hoped that Trump would simply fire the Fed chair. "The law says he can replace the Federal Reserve Chairman for cause," Moore observed in an interview that same week. "Well, the cause is that he's wrecking our economy."

If Moore's approach to legal reasoning seems deficient, one must wonder how he would approach monetary policymaking. Judging by his own statements, a three-month Treasury rate of 0.26% driving a ten-year rate of 2.3% was far too low in December 2015, whereas a three-month rate of 2.42% driving a tenyear rate of 2.55% is far too high today.

What should we make of this? A generous interpretation is that Moore's view of the economy has not changed, and that he has consistently offered his analyses in good faith. In that case, he must genuinely believe that any deviation from a ten-year rate of around 2.4% poses an unacceptable risk - either of creating addicts or of wrecking the economy.

Another generous interpretation is that Moore has consistently offered his analyses in good faith, but has changed his view of the economy. If so, he must be very sorry for having misled people. And presumably, he would be willing to apologize personally to Bernanke, Yellen, and anyone who may have heeded his bad advice between 2010 and 2016.

Of course, a less generous interpretation is that Moore has not changed his view of the economy, and was acting in bad faith during the years of the Obama administration. Or, less likely, he is acting in bad faith now, after having conducted himself in an honest manner up until 2016.

As it happens, none of these interpretations applies, because they are all predicated on the false assumption that Moore actually has an informed perspective of the economy. To my mind, he does not.

The nationalists are right, however, that we have moved too far toward standardizing and harmonizing laws and regulations across countries. In this age of artificial intelligence, companies and traders can surely handle some national regulatory differences. Could we not bring some powers back to the country level, provided global markets remain open? Why must unelected technocrats decide the rules in closed rooms far away? The globalization of governance may be a step too far for globalization's own good.

But Brexiteers take note: the devolution of power will not stop at the national level - as suggested by the murmurs in Scotland and Wales. Declining local communities desperately need new economic activity, while their members have to become more adaptable to globalization and technological change. This often requires local engagement and solutions, aided where necessary by national governments. Political parties could play a constructive role in restoring powers, funding, and often health to many communities.

Rebuilding a strong sense of positive community identity would likely make adversarial nationalism less appealing. At the very least, when people are more able to shape their own futures, they are less likely to be convinced that others are to blame for their plight. To the extent that it weakens support for virulent nationalism, devolution may make the world a little more prosperous - and a lot safer.

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True, Moore has consistently advocated low government spending and opposed progressive taxation. He might even support more open immigration policies, as one would expect from a self-proclaimed free-market conservative. Then again, his views may have changed since he started advising Trump in 2016. After all, he already seems to have abandoned his previous commitment to free trade.

That comes as no surprise. Throughout his career as a partisan talking head, Moore's economic analysis has never had any basis in empirical reality. To the contrary, he has repeatedly shown that he will say whatever needs to be said to please his political master.

Needless to say, Moore is wholly unfit to serve in the office to which he is being nominated. He has absolutely no business overseeing US monetary policy. The same is true of any president who would appoint him and any senator who would vote to confirm him.

It all started as a member of the progressive community, John H. T. Residents of the commercial city of Ganta, Nimba County are breathing a fresh air of relief after mob violence that left two suspects dead and others critically wounded, including security officers.

38-year-old Winston Gonsehn and 35-year-old Festus Gaye were lynched in LPRC Zone 2 community, Ganta after they had been suspected of ritualistic activity.

The victims were among a total of seven individuals onboard a yellow taxicab with plate number LB-4895 that had broken down when one of the occupants of the vehicle hinted a motorcyclist that suspected killers were being transported.

News suddenly spread in the community that people involved in ritualistic practices were being transported, but their car broke down. By then angry mob armed with sticks, rocks, clubs and just anything they could lay their hands on had surrounded the car.

The two suspects mobbed to death and a third person said to be in a critical condition were among seven suspects who were being transported from Saclepea to Sanniquellie for further

investigation for alleged ritualistic killings.

Several police and LDEA officers, who went to their rescue, sustained injuries.

However, police escaped with the two of the suspects, leaving the other five at the mercy of the mob.

The attack followed persistent reports of alleged ritualistic killings in the county, including recent disappearance of a kid, attempts on two others and discovery of burnt remains of a child in Jaco Town, Ganta. Besides, a little girl had gone missing in the Ganta general market after she and her mother went to sell, which may have been the last straw that broke the camel's back, leading to the mob action.

Ganta has witnessed violence of unimaginable proportions with over eight persons, all males, mobbed to death in less than three years.

Two years ago, properties

belonging to a local businessman Prince Howard, including hotel and private residence suffered arson attack, not spearing his mother's grave along the Ganta-Sanniquellie highway.

Report says due to the wave of killings in the county, women groups from all 17 districts organized three-days fast and prayer recently at the Christian Bible Church in Ganta, asking God to expose those behind such wicked act.

The women also threatened to boycott the 2020 senatorial

election, if government did not intervene.

The head for the Nimba Women note that each time election is around, their children cannot move about freely; go to school or get involved with other activities amid news of bodies being discovered in various communities without any arrest by the government.

The head of the Nimba Women for Peace and Reconciliation Argus Bowmah Barr and Mother Josephine Karmo lament that since last month to present, their children are living in fear, while villagers no longer go on their farms for fear for their lives.

A man identified as Melvin Dolo nickname 'War Face' had accused the late Winston Gonsehn for being a witch after the latter won a car key from the former while they were playing cards in Blevalay, district#7.

Prior to their death, Winston Gonsehn and Festus Gaye had been charged in Saclepea for not informing police about discovery of human bones in a river.

Police in Nimba have made several arrests in connection with the violence and suspected perpetrators are being interrogated. *-Editing by Jonathan Browne*

Impeachment halted

The shocking death of Montserrado County District #15 Rep. Adolph Lawrence has prompted the postponement of the ongoing impeachment trial of Associate Justice Kabineh M. Ja'neh at the Liberian Senate for a day.

Announcing the decision Monday, 25 March to postpone the hearing, Liberia's Chief Justice and presiding officer Francis S. Korkpor, Sr. says while the late Rep. Lawrence was not a member of the Liberian Senate, the deceased's wife Sen. NyonbleeKarnga Lawrence is a member of the Senate.

Justice Ja'neh is on trial following accusations by lawmakers that he used his influence as Associate Justice to secure a ruling in his favor at the Supreme Court to take possession of a land being claimed by 94-year-old Madam Annie Yancy Constance, among other charges.

But he denies all the accusations.

News of Rep. Lawrence's

death along with a second victim identified as Gwendolyn Wilson came early Monday morning, with reports suggesting that a jeep personally being operated by the deceased lawmaker en route to Monrovia had collided with a failing truck on Tower Hill along the Roberts International Airport (RIA) Highway, Margibi County.

Rep. Lawrence was said to be returning to Monrovia from Buchanan, Grand Bassa County where he had gone to celebrate his 50th birthday when he and Gwendolvn got killed in the car accident while other occupants of his jeep including a student leader also sustained injuries. The Chairman of the campus - based Students Unification Party (SUP) at the University of Liberia (UL) Carlos T. Edison and Aaron Cassell are said to be in critical condition at the John F. Kennedy Medical Center in Monrovia following the accident. Rep. Lawrence, the husband of Grand Bassa County Sen. NyonbleeKarnga -Lawrence, was pronounced dead at the John F. Kennedy Hospital Sunday night, 24 March following the tragic motor accident along the RIA Highway.

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
Due to the incident, Chief Justice Korkpor says the Legislature is bereaved, noting that bereaved Senator Karnga -Lawrence has been there from the beginning of the impeachment proceedings of Justice Ja'neh.

He says there was no hearing for Monday 25 March, postponing the trial to Tuesday, 26 March at 2PM.

He indicates that it is no secret that a member of the Legislature was involved in a Sudue to appear before the full plenary to report on the death of Mr. Innis who was serving as Deputy Director for Micro Finance at CBL in the Regulation and Supervision Department.

In Rep. Lawrence's communication, he stated that in relation to Innis' death, family members of the late CBL official were contesting report that their relative died of a hit and run accident.

Rep. Lawrence said the family was raising contentions that this alleged incident occurred just after the release of two damaging reports surrounding the printing and importation of billions of Liberian Dollars into the country and a controversial US\$25 million dollars intended to mop - up excess Liberian Dollars by a Technical Economic Management Team (TEMT) and the CBL. The death of Mr. Innis was reported on 3 March, with claims that he was hit by a vehicle at about 2AM. Based on Rep. Lawrence' request, the officials were ordered to appear before the House with all documents required.--Edited by Winston W. Parley

« La femme de chambre est venue au travail à 9 heures. Elle remarqua quelque chose d'étrange. Toute la maison était silencieuse, toutes les portes et les fenêtres étaient verrouillées et le groupe électrogène était toujours en marche dans la maison », a déclaré Charles Gray, un habitant de la communauté, au journaliste de New Dawn.

« Elle a essayé de frapper à la porte mais personne ne répondait de l'intérieur. C'est ainsi qu'elle a alerté les habitants du quartier qui se sont précipités à la maison, ont ouvert la porte et ont trouvé tout le monde inconscient », a raconté M. Grey.



Echo de la conférence Blue Oceans

a résolution de la conférence Blue Oceans qui s'est récemment tenue au Libéria invite les gouvernements du monde entier, y compris les partenaires internationaux, à renforcer la gestion durable des pêches à travers des mesures de gestion fondées sur des bases scientifiques, une approche fondée sur la protection de l'écosystèmes, le suivi, le contrôle et la surveillance ainsi qu'a travers lerenforcement de la coopération en s'appuyant sur les organisations régionales de gestion des pêches et des organismes régionaux des pêches.

La résolution appelle toutes les parties prenantes, y compris les États de la Communauté économique des États de l'Afrique de l'Ouest (CEDEAO), l'Union africaine (UA), l'Union européenne (UE) et les gouvernements régionaux à poursuivre leurs efforts pour soutenir la mise en œuvre de l'objectif de développement durable, dans le contexte de la Stratégie maritime intégrée pour l'Afrique (AIMS) à l'horizon 2050 et le Programme 2030 des Nations Unies.

Les recommandations figurent dans une résolution officielle de la conférence Blue Oceans qui s'est réunie du 18 au 21 mars à la Millennium Guest House à Congo Town, dans la banlieue de Monrovia.

La résolution de la conférence est arrivéeà un meilleurmoment où le Libéria est en train de négocier un accord de pêche avec la République du Sénégal pour 300 navires sénégalais, dont 200 pirogues semi-industrielles et 100 canots artisanaux pour pêcher dans nos eaux en échange de la formation des libériens pêcheurs.

Les Libériens ordinaires sont inquiets de cet accord. Ils le disent clairement, car ils ont du mal à accepter que des étrangers exploitent leurs eaux avec le droit exclusif de pêcher à peu près n'importe quoi.

Les préoccupations des libérienssont aussi sincères que légitimes, d'autant plus que le Sénégal a la mauvaise réputation d'avoir épuisé ses propres eaux maritimes, et se tourne maintenant vers un pays vulnérable et moins sophistiqué tel que le Libéria.

Le poisson fait partie des aliments les plus sains de la planète. Il regorge d'éléments nutritifs importants, telles que les protéines et la vitamine D, et constitue également la meilleure source d'acides gras oméga-3 au monde, qui sont d'une importance capitale pour le développement du corps et du cerveau humains.

Le mois dernier, la Chambre des représentants a demandé à l'Autorité nationale des pêches et de l'aquaculture (NaFAA) de négocier un protocole sur la mise en œuvre de l'Accord de coopération dans le domaine de la pêche et de l'aquaculture entre le gouvernement du Libéria et le gouvernement du Sénégal. Les négociations entre les deux pays pourraient bien être en cours et pourraient bien être à un stade avancé.

Montrer l'Europe sous son vrai jour

BOLOGNE – Où en Europe avons-nous le plus de chances de voir flotter fièrement le drapeau de l'Union européenne audessus des résidences et des immeubles privés ? La réponse est évidente, bien qu'étrange : au Royaume-Uni, chez de citoyens qui redoutent l'idée du Brexit. Est-il vraiment nécessaire de perdre quelque chose que nous aimons - et dont nous avons besoin - avant que nous commencions vraiment à l'apprécier ?

Nous croyons qu'en gage de notre identité européenne commune, les citoyens européens devraient, à partir du 21 mars, afficher fièrement la bannière de l'Union. Face au défi posé par les nationalistes et les populistes avant les élections du Parlement européen au mois de mai, il n'a jamais été aussi important de défendre les valeurs fondamentales de l'Europe. Battre pavillon de l'UE sur nos maisons et nos bureaux peut envoyer un signal indéniable que l'Union ne sera pas rongée par ses ennemis, de l'intérieur ou de l'extérieur.

Dans une période d'incertitude croissante, de frustration et d'obscurcissement de notre destin commun, trop d'Européens semblent inconscients de la longue histoire de dislocation et de guerre qui a précédé la création de l'UE - et de la période sans précédent de paix et de prospérité à laquelle nous sommes parvenus depuis les années 1950. Depuis 70 ans, les institutions communes de l'Europe ont soutenu le marché commun, l'euro et la forte expansion des droits individuels sous la protection de la Cour européenne de justice.

De plus, le modèle de l'État-providence européen est un phare de la civilisation et un exemple pour le monde entier. L'incorporation de la Charte des droits fondamentaux de l'Union européenne dans le Traité de Lisbonne a couronné la construction d'une zone intégrée de 500 millions de personnes fondée sur la démocratie, l'état de droit et la suprême affirmation de la dignité humaine. Quand nous voyageons avec notre passeport européen commun, nous sommes reconnus et respectés dans le monde entier en tant que citoyens d'un

État membre de l'UE vole de ses propres ailes. Après tout, même le plus grand membre de l'UE, l'Allemagne, fait figure de nain par rapport aux États-Unis et à la Chine. Seul, aucun d'entre nous ne peut gérer les énormes défis posés par la technologie, le protectionnisme, le changement climatique ou le terrorisme international.

Mais au lieu de reconnaître que la force de l'Europe est son unité, les forces nationalistes et xénophobes ont bénéficié d'un soutien à travers le continent en promettant de fermer nos frontières, de démanteler la libre circulation et de réaffirmer notre contrôle national sur toutes les politiques publiques. L'augmentation spectaculaire des flux migratoires, principalement en raison de la guerre civile syrienne et de la quasi-anarchie qui règne en Libye, ont créé un terrain fertile pour de répandre leur message de haine xénophobe. En exploitant l'insécurité ressentie par les travailleurs peu qualifiés et par les chômeurs, ils accusent les immigrés de tous les maux de l'Europe. Cependant, étant donné la démographie de l'Europe, l'afflux croissant de migrants qualifiés est nécessaire pour préserver le dynamisme de nos économies et la durabilité de nos systèmes de santé et de retraite.

Oui, les institutions européennes et les politiques ont besoin de profonds changements pour reprendre contact avec les citoyens désabusés. Nous devons montrer à nouveau une capacité à favoriser la croissance et les investissements, à relever les défis des technologies en évolution rapide et les changements climatiques et à revitaliser notre modèle social chancelant. Nous devons montrer que nos institutions communes sont capables et disposées à écouter les demandes d'un public effrayé et que nous pouvons agir ensemble pour protéger nos frontières et pour apporter une plus grande sécurité à nos pays voisins instables de l'Est et du Sud.

Mais il y a aussi un besoin urgent de mobiliser l'opinion publique européenne autour d'un symbole de notre unité et de nos projets futurs : et ce symbole est le drapeau européen. Pour cette raison, en janvier l'un d'entre nous a lancé l'idée qu'à partir du 21 mars, nous arborions le drapeau sur nos maisons, usines et bureaux. Le 21 mars est le premier jour du printemps et nous aimerions croire que les prochaines élections européennes annonceront un nouveau printemps pour le projet européen. Le 21 mars est également l'anniversaire de la mort de saint Benoît, patron de l'Europe. hat there is a Liberian Pandora Box (an ancient Greek Mythology) or a social-cultural and political Can of worms which, when opened, will shock all law-abiding, morally-attuned Liberians to their roots and render Liberia's name and image damaged irreparably at the international community of the comity of nations. Korkoya, who did not admit nor deny the charges, told the High Court that "those making the claim (charges against him) are opening a Pandora Box . . . why come after me . . . take the issue up with the Executive government (represented by the President) that appointed me (Front Page Africa, June 20, 2017)".

Indeed, the Impeachment trial of His Honor Kabineh M. Ja'Neh, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court of Liberia will, in fact, open Liberia's Pandora Box of the Judiciary Branch of (the-now monopolized) international Vice graft/greed or Corruption of confidence artists, liars, thieves, bandits, public dishonesty, moral decadence, etc. - if handled properly, carefully and lawfully.

The Chief Justice of the Supreme Court is head of the Judiciary branch of government with the Supreme Court dominated by lawyers - judges of all lower courts, prosecuting/defense lawyers (powerful counselors and attorneys-at-law) and the Ministry of State for Justice as members of the Liberia National Bar Association, the Police and Security Forces for law enforcement. 6

Indeed, the Judiciary is the only and major fulcrum for interpretation, decision and punishment for law violations, and the investigation and enforcement, for defense, protection and preservation of law for Liberia's democracy.

We were deeply-concerned and troubled by the quality of some candidates-for-President of our nation before and come October 10, 2017 general elections, gualities such as crooks, liars, thieves, dishonesty, profound moral decadence, war-mongers/warlords, rebels, corrupt practices and above all, dual citizens, disloyalty and lack of patriotism to the Republic, particularly, the practice of law, of poli-tricks, selective obedience-disobedience to law and the entire spectrum of the Judicial Process in

Cases in point have been and are the block-busting, ongoing historic trials of prominent attorneys and counselors of government for allegedly demanding and accepting millions of US dollars in bribes to amend/repeal, illegally, Liberian law that is in force and effect, in favor of the Sable Mining Company, a briberyprone, multi-national, foreign-owned corporation. This scheme was exposed by Global Witness, an international watchdog organization.

Most of the indicted defendants are, of course, "politically-connected lawyers". The central figure who, allegedly, dished out the bribes as legal counsel to the Sable Mining Company was the Chairman of the ruling political party and confidante of the nation's President who, also, is Flag Bearer of the same political party. It is alleged that this lawyer-chairman "secured" a contribution of US 200k, illegally, to the ruling part from his foreign client. He is now Liberian senator.

Some Lawyers had been, and are, legal counsels to and in collusion with foreign-owned banks, insurance companies with questionable bail-bond services, and major corporations such as five-star hotels and the only two cellphone companies in cases concerned, mainly, with taxable incomes and questionable payments.

Lawyers are legal counsels to illegal encroachers on private land nationwide including the long-standing Cooper Beach Estate Case already decided by the nation's Supreme Court. The illegal encroachers depend on "politically-connected lawyers", some of which are court judges, to evade eviction. This issue is potential for deadly violence.

Moreover, Lawyers are mainly responsible for thousands being held in detention for long periods without speedy trial because of unreasonable postponements and baffling. No wonder that an overwhelming majority of the nation's population, refer to lawyers as "liars, crooks, deceits and money 'eaters from both sides' of the partieslitigant".

vender-contractor was "sole-sourced" for apparent kickbacks, a crime against law.

According to the New Democrat (New Democrat, December 18, 2013) "the Supreme Court (of the nation), determined to create public (national & international) confidence in the Judicial System . . . appointed several prominent members of . . . civil society organizations to two of its (Judiciary) bodies to help raid the Judiciary of acts of impropriety of judges and lawyers".

But, the Liberia National Bar Association balked and rejected the reform action.

Theophilus Gould, Counselor-at-Law & President of the Liberia National Bar Association said that ". . . matters involving lawyers was normally legal. With negative perceptions being harbored against lawyers by the public . . . involving non-lawyers on the committees of the Supreme Court would tarnish the reputation of lawyers. Already there is a public conception with respect to what they (non-lawyers) think a lawyer is . . . "

It is precisely because the average Liberian, an overwhelming majority of the nation's population "harbor negative perception against lawyers" that the Supreme Court proposal was introduced. Therefore, any reasonable person, particularly, the Lawyer, would welcome and accept the reform action in the effort to educate the non-lawyer and to eradicate his (nonlawyer's) negative thinking of what "a lawyer is". But, unfortunately, for reasons known only to the Bar Association of lawyers, apparently, only for reasons not favorable but inimical to the "public", the Bar Association of lawyers rejected the reform proposal.

For, it is only the Lawyers and the Judicial Process that bear responsibility for the reform action proposed to be implemented (hopefully) by the Honorable, Supreme Court. For example, the public believes that and, in fact, the lawyers are the major cause for delays, delays and delays of persons accused held in detention for months and years without speedy trial.

Recent case in point was that several prisoners broke out of jail and took to the bush in Voinjama, Lofa County because they have been held in jail without trial, adequate food, etc. for years, according to press reports. Contacted, the Superintendent of the County said that he was awaiting reports from the County Attorney, a lawyer.

No doubt, the lawyers of the Bar Association are aware of the historical fight or confrontation/competition for prosecutorial "turf" between lawyers of the same Executive branch of government - LAAC and the Ministry of Justice - with profound, negative impact on nonlawyers accused and held in detention for years, here in Monrovia, and no doubt, also, that the lawyers of the Bar Association are aware of the adage that "justice delayed is justice denied".

ears roll as sorrow struck the hearts of many when the tragic death news of Montserrado County District #15 Rep. Adolph Lawrence hit family members and friends just hours following his c e n t e n a r y b i r t h d a y celebration in Buchanan, Grand Bassa County.

Rep. Lawrence died in a fatal car crash on Monday morning a l o n g t h e R o b e r t s International Airport Highway along with a female student leader Gwendolyn Wilson. Other occupants in the car remain in critical conditions.

The late Rep. Lawrence's wife Senator Nyonblee Kangar Lawrence had hours earlier posted a video which shows the celebrations of her husband's 50th anniversary with and a family reunion hours before his fatal car crash.

News of Rep. Lawrence's sudden death came early Monday morning, 25 March, just a little over a week after the burial of the late Montserrado County Sen. Geraldine Doe - Sheriff which was on Saturday, 16 March.

The death of Rep. Lawrence

now puts Liberia in a situation to further conduct two by elections in Montserrado County alone this year. This follows two previous by elections held in 2018 in Montserrado to fill vacancies created following President George MannehWeah's election and the subsequent election to the Liberian Senate of sitting representative Saah Joseph who replaced President Weah at the Senate. After celebrating his 50th birth anniversary on Sunday, 24 March in Buchanan, Grand Bassa County, reports say Rep. Lawrence was returning to Monrovia when his jeep, crashed into a failing truck on Tower Hill along RIA Highway, Margibi County.

The operator of the truck which Rep. Lawrence's jeep collided with is said to be on the run.

Efforts to establish contacts

with the police for more details did not succeed Monday, but a local radio station reported that Police Spokesman Moses Carter had indicated that police are investigating the incident.

Just before his sudden death, Rep. Lawrence's request was granted by the House of Representatives last week to invite Justice Minister Cllr. Frank Musa Dean and Police Inspector General Col. Patrick Sudue to give report on the mysterious death of Central Bank of Liberia (CBL) official Matthew Innis in an alleged hit and run incident.

Based on Rep. Lawrence' request, the officials were ordered to appear before the House with all documents required this week.

Rep. Lawrence had indicated to the House that family members of the late Innis were contesting report that their relative died of a hit and run accident with an unknown vehicle.

Innis was serving as Deputy Director for Micro Finance at CBL in the Regulation and Supervision Department.

Rep. Lawrence said the family was raising contentions that the alleged hit and run incident that reportedly killed their relative Innis occurred just after the release of two damaging reports surrounding the printing and importation of billions of Liberian Dollars into the country and a controversial US\$25 million dollars intended to mop - up excess Liberian Dollars by a Technical Economic Management Team (TEMT) and the CBL.

The death of Mr. Innis was reported on 3 March, with claims that he was hit by a vehicle at about 2AM. -Edited by Othello B. Garblah

Prosecutors threaten to abandon courts

Prosecutors here have warned that they will not hesitate to abandon the courts across Liberia if authorities do not investigate the flogging and detention of Bomi County Attorney Cllr. Juma P. Karnley on Judge William Sando's alleged order.

The National Association of Prosecutors of Liberia (NAPL) President Cllr. Jerry D.K. Garlawolu issued a statement following report that Judge Sando ordered Cllr. Karnley flogged, handcuffed and incarcerated on Tuesday, 19 March in Tubmanburg.

The NAPL warns that if Judge Williams' alleged action is left unchecked, it could serve as precedence for other judicial authorities to intimidate, humiliate and subjugate prosecutors elsewhere in the country. the Minister of Justice Cllr. Frank Musa Dean to investigate the circumstances that led to the humiliation and incarceration of Cllr. Karnley.

The State lawyers lament that Judge Williams' alleged action "can be equated to misuse and abuse of his authority as a judge."

The prosecutors here are particularly concerned that a writ of contempt was issued on Cllr. Karnley without hearing and at the same time condemning him (Cllr. Karnley) to prison.

"This action on the part of Judge Sando, is an abrogation of the doctrine of due process," the statement says.

It continues that "the unprofessional and unethical conduct of Judge Sando is totally contrary to the dictates of the Code of Moral and Professional Ethics of lawyers in Liberia."

The NAPL strongly demands an investigation of Judge Williams' alleged action, urging further that the judge is reprimanded in conformity with the Judicial Canons for the governance of the conduct of judges here. NAPL however urges its members to continue to render to the courts of the land the due respect and courtesy required of lawyers as prescribed by the Code of Moral and Professional Ethics of lawyers in Liberia in the wake of the Judge Sando saga.--Press release

Mourinho was Madrid's manager from 2010 to 2013,

but the Blancos instead opted to bring back three-time Champions League winner Zidane. And Mourinho himself has now said that the Blancos made the right call, adding that the Frenchman is just getting started in his managerial career despite what he has already achieved.

"I do not think we can talk about a career for him yet," Mourinho said of Zidane on Canal Plus.

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Cardiff to claim Sala transfer 'null and void': report
