# Suspected Arms Dealers Moved Millions in Somali Money Transfers

omali money transfer companies moved more than \$3.7 million in cash between suspected weapons traffickers in recent years, including to a Yemeni under U.S. sanctions for alleged militant links, according to a report seen by Reuters.

The findings by a Genevabased research group, the Global Initiative Against Transnational Organized Crime, could further complicate attempts by Somali transfer companies to retain access to international banking services.

Though they provide a lifeline to millions in the anarchic Horn of Africa nation, few banks will do business with them because of the risk of falling foul of international transparency and anti-money laundering regulations.

Asked about the report, the Central Bank of Somalia, which regulates money transfer firms, said it was unaware of the transfers but would investigate and was in

general making progress in countering terrorism financing.

Contacted by Reuters, the four companies each said they did their best to comply with global "know your customer" norms despite Somalia having no national identity card. The firms also said they maintained databases of internationally-

sanctioned individuals.

The Global Initiative analyzed nearly six years of transaction records from the city of Bossasso, matching them with mobile phone records provided by security sources and database searches.

The report identified 176

transactions from the last six years that it said appeared to be linked to suspected weapons dealers in Somalia and Yemen. Nearly two-thirds were over the \$10,000 threshold that should trigger an automatic report to regulatory authorities.

They include two transfers totaling nearly \$40,000 to numbers linked to Sayf Abdulrab Salem al-Hayashi after the U.S. Treasury sanctioned him in 2017 for allegedly providing weapons and financial support to al Qaeda in the Arabian Peninsula and Islamic State in Yemen, the report said.

Al Hayashi could not be reached for comment.

Somalia-based Amal Express and Iftin Express handled the transactions, which used different combinations of his name and nickname, the report said.

Amal Express said a transfer slip shown in the report and allegedly linked to al Hayashi was a forgery. Iftin Express said the transaction slip was a fake and added that it reported all transactions over \$10,000 to Somali authorities. The report did not find any instances where the other two companies, Dahabshiil and Taaj, made transfers to any sanctioned individuals. But it noted instances where individuals were able to make transfers with them using multiple names and numbers, a violation of Somali law.

One man used 24 names between the four companies, the report said. VOA



# Hotel Rwanda 'hero' Rusesabagina denied bail

Rwandan court has denied bail to Paul Rusesabagina, who was portrayed as a hero in a Hollywood movie about the 1994 genocide. Mr Rusesabagina, who was living in exile until he arrived in Rwanda under mysterious

circumstances at the end of last month, is facing charges of terrorism among other crimes.

In court, the 66-year-old spoke for himself and appealed against the bail denial decision, an independent journalist told the BBC.

The judge said that there

were concerns that, if released, Mr Rusesabagina "would disrupt the ongoing investigation". The court decision means that he will now be moved from police custody to prison.

He is charged with crimes relating to the FLN rebel group's deadly attacks in south-western Rwanda in 2018 and 2019.

Mr Rusesabagina is a leader of the opposition MRCD group, and the FLN is thought to be the group's armed wing.

In a court appearance on Monday, he distanced himself from the FLN's violent attacks. He became well known after the 2004 film Hotel Rwanda depicted his efforts a decade earlier during the genocide to save hundreds of Tutsis at a hotel where he was a manager.

Rwandan genocide survivors' group Ibuka has in the past said that he exaggerated his own role in helping hotel refugees escape the 100-day slaughter.BBC

# Manhunt for 'naked' prisoners in Ugandan hills

Seven out of 219 prisoners who escaped from a jail in north-eastern Uganda have been recaptured, officials say.


Some of the fugitives reportedly took off their distinctive yellow prison uniforms and fled naked into the hills to avoid detection.

The escapees are thought to be trying to use mountain routes to cross the border into Kenya.

# The irony of Ndubuisi Nwabudike leading corruption fight

THE DECISION TO have an individual like Ndubuisi Nwabudike with a questionable nationality credential leading Liberia's corruption fight is not just a mockery of the entire process, but also a paradox. It is similarly shameful and disgraceful that a vital integrity institution such as the Liberia Anti-Corruption Commission (LACC) which the law requires must be headed by a Liberian citizen is being entrusted to the hands of a purportedly naturalized Liberian.

**AMID THIS FLAGRANT** violation of the law of Liberia, President George Manneh Weah is financing the questionable Ndubuisi Nwabudike to organize and preside over a so-called Anti-Corruption Conference when the character himself is an agent of dishonesty and inconsistency.

THE TWO-DAY ANTI-CORRUPTION Conference held at the Ministerial Complex in Congo Town is nothing but complete rubbish and waste of taxpayers' money because the Weah administration, from every indication, lacks political will to restore transparency and accountability in the public sector.

THAT THE SELF-STYLED Nigerian-born Liberian evidently failed to prove his purported naturalization as a Liberian citizen during senate confirmation is sufficient reason not to keep him in the government as an official, spearheading activities of the LACC.

**HOW IN THIS** world can a person like Nwabudike shamelessly carries passports that inconsistently present his dates of birth as October 19, 1960 at one time, October 2, 1963 at another time, October 2, 1965 the next, and October 2, 1969 thereafter respectively, and yet wants Liberians to believe that he has the guts to fight corruption.

IT IS NO surprised that the Liberia National Bar Association was constrained to expel this man as a member of the LNBA because "he became a member of the Liberian National Bar Association through fraudulent means."

YET, HE CURRENTLY presides over the LACC without any remorse for his deeds, taking the people of Liberia for granted and lording over the country with support from President Weah. Now, everyone should understand why the so-called anti-corruption conference and its outcome are a complete

IN THE FIRST place, the Weah administration has no intention to fighting corruption when the President himself acquired questionable wealth like many of his officials immediately after coming to power that are hardly distinguishable from private assets and public funds.

#### The Environmental Consequences of Political Repression

Zimbabwean President Emmerson Mnangagwa and the military junta that facilitated his rise to power have not done much to change the country since driving the aging despot Robert Mugabe from power in 2017. Zimbabwe is now a poster child for the link between authoritarianism and environmental degradation.

rising star. Boasting robust human capital, considerable natural-resource wealth, and modern infrastructure, it was the continent's leading producer of crops such as maize, wheat, and soybeans. Agricultural exports earned it the moniker "the breadbasket of Africa." How far the country has fallen.

Today, Zimbabwe can barely feed its own people, let alone the rest of the continent. According to the World Food Program, some 8.6 million Zimbabweans need help, and acute malnutrition is expected to rise by 15% in 2020, exacerbated by the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic. Moreover, the government is failing to provide basic services, such as safe drinking water, health care, adequate housing, and education.

Zimbabwe is also enduring one of the worst economic meltdowns in its history - and the second in a little over a decade. The country is now beset by runaway inflation, severe fuel shortages, prolonged power outages, and mounting unemployment. Some 90% of Zimbabweans now struggle to make their living in the informal sector.

These problems began with severe economic mismanagement under Robert Mugabe, whose 37-year-long rule - which ended when the military forced him to resign in 2017 - was marked by severe, often violent political repression. But Mugabe's successor, President Emmerson Mnangagwa, and the military junta that facilitated his rise to power have not brought much change. Not only have they done little to reform the economy and create conditions for investment and growth; they have also maintained Mugabe's repressive practices.

But it is not only Zimbabwe's people who are suffering from the regime's behavior. So is the environment. The Forestry Commission of Zimbabwe estimates that the country is losing 330,000 hectares of forestland per year, and that total forest and woodland cover has of electricity and the high cost of gas for agricultural purposes. cooking.

Deforestation in Zimbabwe has contributed to the decrease in annual rainfall in the region over the last decade. (Air that passes over trees produces twice as much rain as air that does not.) Given Zimbabwe's location in the tropics, which makes it particularly vulnerable to shifting rainfall patterns, this has contributed to recurrent droughts - a major driver of rising food insecurity.

Reduced rainfall has also affected electricity generation, by forcing a partial shutdown of the hydroelectric plant on Lake Kariba in 2019, which supplies over 50% of Zimbabwe's all.

ARARE - Zimbabwe was once Africa's  $\,$  electricity, as well as electricity for Zambia. A shortage of foreign currency puts Zimbabwe's alternative source of electricity - imports from Mozambique and South Africa - out of reach. In 2019, power outages lasting up to 18 hours became routine, disrupting economic activity.

> When it comes to delivering other services - such as managing urban waste and supplying potable water - the government's failures seem intentional. Over the last 20 years, the opposition Movement for Democratic Change Alliance (MDC-A), led by Nelson Chamisa, has gained popularity, and now controls 26 out of 32 urban local governments. To assert its authority, the ruling Zimbabwe African National Union-Patriotic Front (ZANU-PF) - the party of Mugabe and Mnangagwa - has used its power to circumvent constitutional provisions that give residents and local authorities greater control of service delivery.

> The politicization of basic services has undermined their delivery significantly. Poor waste management allowed the capital city of Harare's main water source, Lake Chivero, to become heavily polluted from sewage effluent, causing eutrophication (when nutrient buildup causes excessive vegetation growth). According to a recent report by the Harare City Council, water from Lake Chivero is now contaminated with substances linked to liver and centralnervous-system ailments.

> Harare's main water-treatment facility, built with a capacity to serve 300,000 people, today supplies water to over 1.5 million, and is not nearly up to the task. The combination of inadequate waste management and a lack of potable water was responsible for the 2008 cholera outbreak, which claimed over 4,000 lives.

Gold mining, a key economic activity since before colonialism, is furthering jeopardizing Zimbabweans' health. But political uncertainty and an unfavorable business environment have weakened investment in the industry. So most mining, some 60%, is carried out illegally, with no regard for environmental or safety standards. dropped from 53% to 45% since 2014. > Enforcing environmental standards is not a priority for Zimbabwe's government, because gold is a valuable source of foreign currency. According to Transparency International Zimbabwe, however, the country is losing over \$200 million each year, as huge amounts of gold are sold on the black market and eventually smuggled out of the country to places like Dubai and South Africa.

> Zimbabwe embodies the nexus of political repression, poor governance, and environmental degradation. The effects are not bound by national borders, so this nexus should concern us

### "Don't be 'Smart", be "Wise' President Weah"

E Dr. George MannehOppong Weah is the 25th President, Republic of Liberia, Head of State, and Commander-In-Chief of the Armed Forces of Liberia. The 53-year old Head-of-State is married to Madam Clar Weah, a Jamaican native. They are blessed with three children including George Weah Jr. Timothy Tarpeh Weah both are residence abroad. President Weah began a professional football career with a local football the soccer team called 'Young Survivors Clara town in 1981 and completed his football career in 200l3 with the football team Al Jazira FC, a football club (the United Arab Emirates, Abu Dhabi in the UAE Arabian Gul). # Harper Port Manager rehabilitates community roads

he Manager of the Harper Sea Port in Maryland County, William W. Wallace has joined citizens in reconditioning roads leading to Lake Shepherd and William R. Tolbert Drive communities in Harper

Both areas are known as Stadium Road communities.

The intervention by Port Manager Wallace followed attempts by residents of the two communities to recondition roads to their communities that have been challenged by downpours and flooding.

The situation has impeded movement of residents in and out of the communities, especially women and children, who usually falloff from commercial motorbikes transporting

Mr. Wallace said though rehabilitating all community roads in Harper could be cost intensive, seeing economic hardship engulfed by the government, his own intervention is a way of buttressing government's commitment to recondition feeder roads that pose embarrassment to residents.

Although it is not clear whether he has political motive, but it seems the former 2017 Representative Candidate, who contested in Harper District on the ticket of the governing Coalition for Democratic Change is paving his way for 2023.

"Let me appreciate the youths of Lake Shepherd community for joining hands with me to recondition the road,



them to various locations.

Speaking to this paper recently, Mr. Wallace said his intervention is in response to numerous cries from residents about the road situation and his personal observation along the roads where women and school-going kids have dropped from motorbikes into muddy waters several times.

He added that several occasions, while on his way to work, he saw school children in their uniforms falling of bikes into mud, messing themselves.

"Let me say it is worrisome mostly to see kids that are already dressed by their parents falling in the mud, knowing how desperate other parents are seeing their children going back home with uniforms dirty", he

as you can see now, I am working with the youths and this is one of the things I love during the best because I am a young man. I know they will continue to join hands with me in the district for us to recondition some of these major community roads, knowing to the fact that government can't do all at the same time", her said.

Wallace disclosed that his next target is to touch other community roads in the county.

For their part, residents of Lake Shepherd community lauded the Port Manager for the initiative and called on other officials of the county to emulate his example. - Editing by Jonathan

### Judiciary orders staff to abort protest | CPP Cummings to address

ollowing a series of protests by staff at the Judicial branch of government for 11 months of unpaid Liberian dollars component of their salaries, the Judiciary warns that protests, demonstration, and strike actions are in violation of the law and cannot be allowed to continue because

"Protests, demonstration, and strike actions, etc., disrupt court processes and deprive party litigants of unhindered right of access to justice; these are in violation of law and cannot be allowed to continue," the Judiciary says further.

The Judiciary maintains that as it remains engaged with the

posted placards on the facilities at the Temple of Justice on Capitol Hill Thursday, 17 September, seeking to notify members of a planned protest due Monday, 21 September.

"The Union of [Aggrieved] Judicial Workers is pleased to inform you all to be [prepared] for the Strike Action/Go slow to [begin] Monday," one notice posted at the entrance of the Judiciary's Cafeteria reads. Some of the protesters claim that some placards were taken down supposedly by authorities before the afternoon hours.

In its statement Thursday, the Judiciary said it acknowledges the concerns of its employees regarding cuts in their salaries by the Government of Liberia under the program of Harmonization and Standardization which took effect about a year ago.

According to the Judiciary, when the matter was first raised with the Chief Justice Francis S. Korkpor, Sr., he set up a committee to listen to the concerns of the employees with the view of providing appropriate explanations.

While this was being done, the Judiciary laments that some of the employees resulted to protests which prompted a meeting of the employees with the Full Bench of the Supreme Court.

At that meeting which was

"Information is that these employees intend to disrupt the ensuing opening of the Civil Law Court. The Judiciary is a neutral ground where party litigants go to seek remedy within the ambit of the law," a statement issued in Monrovia Thursday, 17 September by the Judiciary

### Visually impaired people protest for Covid-19 food

n the wake of rumors about exhaustion of the government Corona virus stimulus food package for vulnerable Liberians, group of visually-impaired citizens from the Hope in God Association of the Blind have protested before the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Monrovia, demanding their share of the stimulus package.

# NdubuisiNwabudikeà la tête de la lutte contre la corruption, quelle ironie!

Le fait qu'un individu comme NdubuisiNwabudikedont la nationalité est douteuse dirige la lutte contre la corruption au Libéria n'est pas que paradoxal, il s'agit au fait une moquerie à part entière.

# Les conséquences environnementales de la répression politique

ARARE - Le Zimbabwe était hier encore l'étoile montante de l'Afrique. Fort d'un solide capital humain, de généreuses ressources naturelles, et d'infrastructures modernes, le pays était à l'échelle du continent le premier producteur de variétés telles que le maïs, le blé ou encore le soja. Ses exportations agricoles lui valaient le surnom de « grenier de l'Afrique ». Comment expliquer qu'il soit tombé aussi bas?

Aujourd'hui, le Zimbabwe parvient à peine à nourrir sa propre population, sans parler du reste du continent. D'après le Programme alimentaire mondial, environ 8,6 millions de Zimbabwéens ont besoin d'aide, et la malnutrition sévère devrait augmenter de 15 % en 2020, aggravée par l'impact de la pandémie de COVID-19. Le gouvernement échoue par ailleurs à assurer les services publics essentiels, tels que l'eau potable, les soins de santé, le logement et l'éducation.

Le Zimbabwe connaît par ailleurs actuellement l'un des pires effondrements économiques de son histoire - le second en un peu plus d'une décennie. Le pays est aujourd'hui confronté à une inflation galopante, à de multiples pénuries de carburant, à des pannes d'électricité prolongées, ainsi qu'à un chômage croissant. Pas moins de 90 % des Zimbabwéens peinent à gagner leur vie dans le secteur informel.

Ces difficultés ont débuté avec la gestion économique désastreuse de Robert Mugabe, dont le règne de 37 ans - qui ne s'est achevé que lorsque l'armée a contraint le dirigeant de se retirer en 2017 - a été marqué par une répression politique sévère, et souvent violente. Le successeur de Mugabe, le président Emmerson Mnangagwa, et la junte militaire qui a facilité son accession au pouvoir, n'ont pour autant pas apporté de réel changement. Ils ont non seulement très peu œuvré pour réformer l'économie et créer des conditions propices à l'investissement et à la croissance, mais également maintenu les pratiques répressives de Mugabe

Mais la population du Zimbabwe n'est pas la seule à souffrir des agissements du régime. L'environnement souffre lui aussi. La Commission des forêts du Zimbabwe estime que le pays perd chaque année 330 000 hectares de forêts, et que la superficie totale de zones forestières et boisées est passée de 53 % à 45 % depuis 2014. Raison principale à cela, les Zimbabwéens dépendent de la biomasse pour environ 70 % de leur énergie, compte tenu du manque d'électricité ainsi que du prix élevé du gaz nécessaire à la cuisine.

La déforestation du Zimbabwe alimente depuis une décennie la diminution des précipitations annuelles dans la région (l'air qui circule à travers les arbres produisant deux fois plus de pluie qu'en l'absence d'arbres). Le Zimbabwe se situant géographiquement au niveau du tropique sud, ce qui rend le pays particulièrement vulnérable au changement des modèles de précipitations, les sécheresses y deviennent de plus en plus récurrentes - un facteur majeur d'aggravation de l'insécurité alimentaire.

La diminution des précipitations impacte également la production d'électricité, la centrale hydroélectrique du lac Kariba ayant par exemple dû fermer partiellement en 2019, elle qui fournit plus de 50 % de l'électricité du Zimbabwe, ainsi qu'une partie de celle de la Zambie. Le manque

de devises étrangères exclut par ailleurs la possibilité de sources alternatives d'électricité pour le pays - via par exemple des importations en provenance du Mozambique et de l'Afrique du Sud. En 2019, les pannes de courant de plus de 18 heures sont devenues une habitude, et perturbent bien entendu l'activité économique.

S'agissant de la fourniture des autres services notamment gestion des déchets urbains et fourniture d'eau potable - les manquements du gouvernement semblent en revanche intentionnels. Ces 20 dernières années, l'Alliance du mouvement pour le changement démocratique (MDC-A), parti d'opposition conduit par Nelson Chamisa, a gagné en popularité, et contrôle aujourd'hui 26 des 32 gouvernements urbains locaux. Pour affirmer son autorité, l'Union nationale africaine du Zimbabwe-Front patriotique (ZANU-PF) au pouvoir - parti de Mugabe et de Mnangagwa - a usé de son influence pour contourner les dispositions constitutionnelles conférant aux résidents et autorités locales un plus grand contrôle sur la fourniture des services.

Cette politisation des services essentiels met considérablement à mal leur fourniture. La gestion désastreuse des déchets a engendré une importante pollution aux eaux usées dans le lac Chivero, principale source d'eau de la capitale Harare, avec pour conséquence un phénomène d'eutrophisation (accumulation de nutriments et croissance excessive de végétation). D'après un récent rapport du Conseil municipal de Harare, l'eau du lac Chivero est désormais contaminée par des substances susceptibles de provoquer des atteintes au foie et au système nerveux.

La principale centrale de traitement des eaux de Harare, dont la capacité permet de desservir 300 000 personnes, et qui fournit aujourd'hui de l'eau à plus d'1,5 million d'habitants, est très loin de suffire. Traitement défaillant des déchets et manque d'eau potable ont ensemble provoqué une épidémie de choléra en 2008, qui a fait plus de 4 000 morts.

Activité économique majeure avant le colonialisme, l'extraction d'or met par ailleurs à mal la santé des Zimbabwéens. L'incertitude politique et les défaillances de l'environnement d'affaires ont en effet réduit les investissements dans ce secteur. C'est ainsi qu'environ 60 % de l'exploitation aurifère est conduite dans l'illégalité, sans aucune considération pour les normes environnementales et de sécurité. Résultat, la pollution s'aggrave dans la rivière Mazowe, qui coule du Zimbabwe jusqu'au Mozambique, et dont l'eau de plus en plus toxique est utilisée par les ménages, pour les loisirs et pour l'agriculture.

La conformité aux normes environnementales ne figure pas parmi les priorités du gouvernement zimbabwéen, dans la mesure où l'or constitue une source précieuse de devises étrangères. D'après Transparency International Zimbabwe, le pays perd néanmoins plus de 200 millions \$ chaque année en raison des quantités massives d'or vendu sur le marché noir, puis expédié en contrebande vers des pays tels que Dubaï et l'Afrique du Sud.

Le Zimbabwe cumule tristement répression politique, mauvaise gouvernance et dégradation environnementale, avec des conséquences qui ne s'arrêteront pas aux frontières nationales, et dont nous devons tous nous inquiéter.

While the protest was ongoing on the grounds of the Foreign Ministry, Deputy Minister of State Anthony Kpawankpa asked the group leaders to select three of its members for an indoor meeting that lasted for an hour.

Upon the completion of the meeting, Kaiwood informed his colleagues that the Minister is in solidarity with them and has asked them to formally write the Minister of State for Presidential Affairs Nathaniel McGill for redress within a week.

Kaiwood further lamented that they are willing to adhere to the discussion with the Deputy Minister but if their communication were not fruitful, they will reassemble at the Foreign Ministry until their demand is met by the government.

A female blind protester, who identified herself as Martha, said they are being poorly treated by the government that supposed to champion the cause by ensuring their livelihood is improved.

"We are been left out by the government as a means of encouraging us to continue begging in the street, this is the highest insult we have received in recent time. We will continue with our civil engagement until we can get redress but if government or WFP refuses to supply us with our food, we will continue to sleep here till the President addresses our dissatisfaction," Ma Martha angrily noted.

The New Dawn has not established whether the Covid-19 stimulus food distribution has formally ended, but the exercise has been marred by series of controversies, delays and criticisms from its onset. -Editing by Jonathan Browne

# Liverpool agree £25m deal for Bayern's Thiago



iverpool have agreed a deal to sign midfielder Thiago Alcantara from Bayern Munich for at least £20m, plus £5m in add-ons, on a four-year contract.

Thiago, 29, joined the German giants from Barcelona in 2013 and played in last season's Champions League final victory over Paris St-Germain.

He is set to wear the number six shirt at Anfield.

Thiago would be the Premier League champions' second summer signing, after Greece left-back Kostas Tsimikas.

The guaranteed £20m will be paid in instalments, with the maximum extra £5m depending on the Reds' success in the Premier League and Champions League.

When asked about a


potential move for the Spaniard last week, Liverpool manager Jurgen Klopp said: "I cannot end speculation as long as the transfer window is open. "It is nice that we are linked with him but that is pretty much it really. It is because he is a good player and Liverpool is a big club, so that is nice."

Bayern boss Hansi Flick said at a news conference on Thursday: "Thiago is an exceptional player who had huge success here for seven years. He's a great person and an exceptional professional.

"It was very emotional today when he said goodbye."

Thiago started his career at Barcelona and was heavily linked with a move to Manchester United when David Moyes replaced Sir Alex Ferguson in 2013, but went to Germany instead.

As well as the Champions League, he has won seven consecutive Bundesliga titles, four German Cups and the Club World Cup with Bayern.



# Bale set to fly in to complete Spurs loan move

eal Madrid forward Gareth Bale is set to fly to England on Friday to complete his return to Tottenham Hotspur.

A deal for Wales international Bale, 31, to rejoin Spurs on loan from Real Madrid is still being negotiated.

Talks between the clubs are progressing positively if they conclude in the same manner, Bale will travel to London.

"Until I'm told Bale is a Tottenham player, I still think and feel and respect the fact he's a Real Madrid player," said Spurs boss Jose Mourinho.

"I'm not going to comment on a Real Madrid player," Mourinho added after his side beat Lokomotiv Plovdiv in the Europa League on Thursday.

Bale is understood to have trained on his own at Real on Thursday while awaiting the outcome of negotiations.

It is also anticipated Real



Madrid full-back Sergio Reguilon will complete his transfer to Tottenham on Friday. The 23-year-old Spain international played last season on loan at Sevilla, winning the Europa League.

He originally joined Spurs from Southampton in 2007 before moving to the Spanish giants for a then world record £85m in 2013. He has gone on to score more than 100 goals for Real and won four Champions Leagues.
