

Mali Attaches Conditions to Handing Over Late PM's Body - Says Family

Relatives of the late former prime minister of Mali say the country's military government has refused to turn over his body unless they agree not to request an autopsy.

Soumeylou Boubèye Maiga died March 21, 2022, at a Bamako hospital after seven months in detention.

Maiga served under former President Ibrahim Boubacar Keita, who was deposed in a

2020 coup. Maiga was arrested in August 2021 on charges of fraud.

His health deteriorated while in jail, and his family repeatedly sought permission to get him released for treatment. For the last three months, he has been under guard at a Bamako clinic.

At Maiga's home in central Bamako on March 22, where his family gathered to receive guests, his brother Mohamed Boubèye Maiga said the military government has refused to hand over his body unless the family

agrees not to request an autopsy.

He added that Maiga's family, friends and lawyers had been refused access to Maiga in recent months as his health deteriorated, so no loved ones were present when Maiga died.

Several Malian political parties, along with the head of Mali's U.N. mission and the president of neighboring Niger, have publicly reacted to Maiga's death.

The spokesperson for a group of opposition parties, Ismael Sacko, talked to VOA from Bamako via a messaging app.

Sacko said Maiga's death could have been a form of political assassination, so an investigation is crucial.

Aguibou Bouare, president of Mali's National Human Rights Commission, a governmental agency that investigates human rights abuse accusations, said that the commission monitored Maiga's case, but it was denied access to the former prime minister while he was in the hospital.


Bouare said that all prisoners, including Maiga, who had not yet been tried have the

right to medical treatment and to receive visits from family. Human rights must be respected at all times, in all places, and in all circumstances, he said, especially during exceptional circumstances and periods of crisis.

VOA attempted to reach a Malian army spokesman for comment, but got no response.

The government released a short statement Monday announcing Maiga's death "after a long illness."

The military government ordered Radio France Internationale and France 24 off the air last week after RFI and Human Rights Watch reported on alleged human rights abuses by Mali's army. VOA

US Sanctions Sudan's Central Police Force

Sudanese human rights defenders are welcoming the U.S. Treasury Department's imposition of sanctions against Sudan's Central Reserve Police (CRP) for using excessive violence against peaceful protesters. But these activists say the U.S. and other nations should take further measures against the military regime that took power in Sudan last year.

The U.S. Treasury Department's Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC) announced Monday that "all property and interests in property of the CRP that are in or come within the United States, or that are in the possession or control of U.S. persons, are blocked and must be reported to OFAC."

Mohamed Osman, a Human Rights Watch researcher in Khartoum, said the CRP has been

accused of oppressing Sudanese protesters since the coup on October 25. He noted that the police unit has a well-documented record of abuse during the 2018 and 2019 protests that led to the overthrow of longtime president Omar al-Bashir and, before that, in conflict areas of Darfur and Kordofan.

"The move is long overdue," Osman told VOA's South Sudan in Focus. He said HRW's own research found that the CRP also led post-coup crackdowns on protesters on Nov. 17, 2021, and January 17 of this year.

Sanctions appreciated Osman appreciates the sanctions but believes they should be part of a larger package of punitive measures to be effective.

Repeated attempts to reach Sudan police spokesperson Brigadier General Hassan el-Tijani Ahmed for comment received no reply.

Sudan denies presence of Russian mercenaries

Sudan has denied the presence of a Russian private military contractor in the country.

The denial follows a joint statement by British, American and Norwegian envoys that Wagner Group personnel had

Recently, Sudan's deputy leader, Lt Gen Mohamed Hamdan "Hemeti" Dagalo, visited Moscow - and was in the country on the day Russia invaded Ukraine.

Russia's mercenaries have been accused of committing

been engaged in social media disinformation campaigns and illegal gold mining in Sudan.

"The Sudanese government wishes to deny [these reports] in totality," Sudan's Ministry of Foreign Affairs said.

The authorities accused the Western diplomats of attempting to draw Sudan into the ongoing war between Russia and Ukraine.

Sovereign Council issued a statement on December 31 condemning violence against protesters and directed "legal and security" authorities to address the issue. The Council also announced it had launched an investigation into

human rights abuses in neighbouring Central African Republic (CAR). Western countries also say Wagner mercenaries have been deployed in Mali.

The paramilitary group has thousands of fighters in Libya, where they have been backing renegade general, Khalifa Haftar, against forces loyal to a government in Tripoli. BBC

LP split erodes Brumskine's political legacy

THE POLITICAL LEGACY of Cllr. Charles walker Brumskine as a unifier, nationalistic statesman and an ardent promoter of political tolerance is being gradually eroded by the party he founded and left behind.

SINCE THE DEMISE of Cllr. Brumskine in 2019, the Liberty Party has failed to keep its focus. Instead, it has degenerated into personality contest fueled by selfish ambitions and factional loyalty, abandoning the code mission of providing alternative leadership to the Liberian people.

THE LP HAS failed to remain a cohesive political force or to speak with one voice. Even in its attempt to remain in a collaboration has been sheltered by a split right down the middle with Chairman Musa Hassan Bility going his own way while Political Leader Senator Nyonblee Kangar Lawrance is headed for another direction.

NOW THE FACTION led by Political Leader Senator Kangar Lawrance has parted with the now disintegrated Collaborating Political Parties (CPP), leaning on the side of former ruling Unity Party, as Chairman Bility sits on other side, trying to find his own compass rather than what Brumskine left behind.

CERTAINLY, THIS is not the kind of political institution the late Cllr. Brumskine had envisaged when he organized the Liberty Party. He envisaged a strong party would made it presence felt on the political scene, something that he achieved from the very inception of the LP in 2005.

THOUGH IT NEVER emerged victorious from the three last elections, the party rose and found itself among the top three political parties in Liberia after the civil war in 2004. But its spirit became to dwindle after the 2017 elections and the subsequent death of founding father Brumskine.

THE NYONBLEE KANGAR-Lawrance leadership has failed to uphold and protect the Brumskine Legacy with the LP. It is so sad.

A HOME THAT his divided against itself can't stand. Liberty Party is rapidly diminishing as a political force just a year after Brumskine departed. The party now exists by name, losing relevance.

CAN BILITY AND Madam Nyonblee Lawrance bury their egos and reunite Liberty Party for Brumskine's sake? Both officials ought to know that party is about the people rather than selfish interest.

THESE TWO LEADERS are disappointing Brumskine in his grave. They need to change course before the 2023 elections to keep the legacy of Cllr. Brumskine's alive.

Prosecuting Putin Starts Now

EDINBURGH - The world has responded to Russia's invasion of Ukraine with sanctions, travel bans, and deliveries of humanitarian and military aid, all of which have been stepped up as Russian President Vladimir Putin's war crimes claim more lives every day. Now, with the Ukrainian people's courage and solidarity having stirred the collective conscience of Europe and much of the world, pressure is growing to complement these measures with criminal indictments of Putin and his closest associates.

The momentum is global. Some 140 prominent jurists and former leaders have issued a declaration of support for a "special tribunal for the punishment of the crime of aggression against Ukraine" - an idea first proposed by Philippe Sands of University College London. Indeed, Ukraine's lead prosecutor has announced that she is already compiling evidence of war crimes committed by Putin and his forces, and legal authorities in Germany and Poland are launching investigations of their own. In Spain, a magistrate has been building a case upon which to issue international arrest warrants for Putin's inner circle, as was done 20 years ago to arraign Chile's former dictator, Augusto Pinochet.

Moreover, following requests from at least 39 countries, the lead prosecutor of the International Criminal Court is opening an investigation into war crimes and crimes against humanity in Ukraine (though the ICC cannot prosecute Russia for the specific crime of aggression). And Michelle Bachelet, the United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights, has announced that a UN Human Rights Council commission of inquiry will compile a dossier documenting crimes against humanity, war crimes, and aggression.

Meanwhile, Russia's own hired legal gun at the International Court of Justice has resigned, saying, "Enough is enough. It's become impossible for me to represent a country that so cynically despises the law."

Putin's crimes are so grave that all investigations are both essential and welcome. But the priority now is to move fast. The world needs to send a message to the people of Ukraine that the world will act, and to Russia's current leadership that anyone helping to sustain Putin's war of aggression will not escape with impunity and would do well to distance themselves from the regime and start turning over evidence.

A decision on a special international tribunal has been requested by Ukraine, and we need European governments to support that call. But we could already

establish an interim office to investigate all incidents that may constitute the crime of aggression. An interim prosecutor could be appointed to compile the evidence and consider the basic questions - the nature of prosecution, the issue of immunity, and the rules of procedure. This operation would preferably be based in The Hague, and it need not involve more than ten staff members. With financial support from one or two governments, it could work closely with the ICC in their respective but complementary investigations.

The crime of aggression is a relatively straightforward offense to investigate and prosecute. It applies to all those who plan, initiate, influence, or shape an overall policy of aggression. A group of American lawyers has already done impressive work documenting what they consider to be acts of aggression committed by Putin, starting with his 2014 decisions to seize Crimea and to deploy troops in Ukraine's Donbas region.

Putin's crime of aggression against Ukraine does not end with the invasion that began on February 24. It has continued with each deliberate attack on Ukrainian cities and towns, with his targeting of innocent civilians, with his refusal to honor humanitarian corridors and ceasefires, and with his use of nuclear power stations to extort the Ukrainian government.

When war crimes committed in Yugoslavia and Rwanda were on the agenda 30 years ago, US President Bill Clinton led a bold initiative to create special tribunals that were eventually endorsed by the UN Security Council. The justifications given then are no less relevant today. The Americans saw a need for moral leadership. A tribunal was not there to favor any one race, religion, or ethnic group, Clinton explained. But it would, as he said then, draw a line between those who had decided to wield a clenched fist and those who were willing to extend an open hand. That, he said, is ultimately the one dividing line that really matters.

Our task today is the same. We must draw a line between those who see the world as a never-ending struggle between "us" and "them," and those who would embrace our common humanity. By beginning the process of investigating, documenting, and prosecuting Russia's international crimes, we can give the people of Ukraine - and the world - a realistic hope that justice will be done and our common humanity acknowledged.

Parti de la Liberté : Le camp Kangar-Lawrence se retire de la CPP

Le camp du parti de la liberté fidèle à la sénatrice Nyonblee Kangar-Lawrence a officiellement annoncé, le lundi 21 mars 2022, son retrait de la Collaboration des Partis Politiques (CPP), une alliance des principaux partis politiques de l'opposition.

L'ALP (All Liberian Party) et l'UP (Unity Party, ancien parti au pouvoir) avaient, il y

a quelques mois, déjà annoncé leur retrait de la coalition politique de l'opposition dont l'objectif initial était de présenter un candidat unique afin de battre le président actuel George Weah lors de la prochaine présidentielle.

Faisant l'annonce lors d'une conférence de presse tenue le lundi 21 mars 2022, le secrétaire général national de la faction Nyounblee Kangar-Lawrence, M. Jacob Julius Smith, a expliqué

que la décision découle de l'avis du Conseil consultatif.

Il a déclaré que le Conseil consultatif s'est réuni dans la ville portuaire de Buchanan, dans le comté de Grand Bassa, du 28 au 29 janvier 2022, et a mandaté le Comité exécutif national du parti par une résolution pour retirer le LP de la CPP.

L'ambassadeur McCarthy ne veut pas du mal au Libéria

Il est malheureux que l'ambassadeur des États-Unis Michael McCarthy ait été la cible de propos durs, certains dans les journaux et d'autres dans lors d'émissions de débats en direct, pour avoir attiré l'attention sur le fait que la ville de Monrovia est très sale et contredit les autorités de Monrovia City Corporation qui disent que la ville de Monrovia a été abandonnée et ne bénéficie plus de soutiens financiers de la part des partenaires étrangers.

Certains animateurs des débats télévisés pensent pas que l'ambassadeur des États-Unis se mêle aux affaires intérieures du Libéria en tentant de contredire les autorités de la ville. Mais nous ne sommes pas d'accord, car les membres du corps diplomatique ici font partie intégrante de la société libérienne. Ce qui affecte notre capitale en termes de manque d'élimination appropriée et d'ordures a également un impact sur leurs activités et leur bien-être au Libéria.

Plus précisément, l'ambassadeur McCarthy a déclaré dans un O-PED qu'il avait écrit le mardi 15 mars 2022 pour commémorer le 200e anniversaire du premier président du Libéria, Joseph Jenkins Roberts (célébré chaque année comme une fête nationale), « qu'aurait dit le défunt président à propos de l'état actuel du pays qui est maintenant englouti par la corruption systémique, la gouvernance du barreau et l'échec du leadership, entre autres? »

Il a ensuite repris un commentaire fait lors de la célébration de la Journée de Monrovia le mois dernier lorsqu'un haut fonctionnaire a regretté que, contrairement à ses trois années précédentes au pouvoir, "aucun donateur ou partenaire externe ne finance les coûts récurrents de la collecte et de l'élimination des déchets solides". Ce fonctionnaire estimait que la ville avait été abandonnée par la communauté internationale. L'ambassadeur s'est ainsi demandé de savoir s'il y a une responsabilité plus fondamentale d'une mairie locale que de rendre sa ville propre.

Malheureusement, le diplomate américain a automatiquement été la cible de vives critiques de plusieurs sources, certaines mettant en cause le manque de soutien des États-Unis au gouvernement du Libéria et la manière dont les fonds destinés au développement sont gérés par l'Agence américaine pour le développement international ou l'USAID.

En tant que partenaire historique et traditionnel du Libéria, les ambassadeurs des États-Unis accrédités près de cette capitale sont tenus d'attirer l'attention des autorités gouvernementales libériennes chaque fois que les choses ne vont pas correctement. Et c'est exactement ce que M. McCarthy a fait dans son O-PED.

Nous, Libériens, parlons avant de penser. Avons-nous oublié si tôt les sacrifices que les États-Unis ont faits et continuent de faire pour sortir les Libériens des conditions de santé désagréables et de la pauvreté ? Il a fallu que les États-Unis mettent à disposition l'argent de ses contribuables, en collaboration avec les Nations Unies, la CEDEAO et l'Union Africaine pour que nous jouissions aujourd'hui d'une paix relative.

En vérité, l'ambassadeur Michael McCarthy n'est pas le premier diplomate étranger au Libéria à dénoncer l'état sanitaire épouvantable de Monrovia. L'année dernière, le chef de la mission de l'UE à Monrovia a décrit Monrovia comme la « ville la plus sale » de toutes les villes qu'il a vues en Afrique.

En tant que Libériens, nous devrions nous regarder dans le miroir pour voir les réalités auxquelles cette nation est confrontée et faire honnêtement des progrès pour y faire face au lieu de condamner les critiques saines qui sont destinées à notre bien.

"National disgrace"

--CSO terms growing SGBV cases in Liberia

The head of the Civil Society Network of Liberia Sensee Kiadii has described the growing wave of Sexual and Gender - Based Violence (SGBV) cases across the country as a national disgrace, saying his group is preparing to put the government's feet to the fire to combat this evil act in accordance with the law.

Speaking at a news conference at the Civil Society

Network of Liberia is calling on the Government of Liberia through its relevant authority and all stakeholders to address what he referred to as "national disgrace."

Mr. Kiadii called on Liberians to rise up and demand that justice is done, noting that it is unjust for babies as young as three and two years old, and girls, women and young boys to go through these kinds of traumatic experiences when the country has the capability to stop what is happening.

Kiadii further indicated that the Civil Society Network of Liberia condemns all acts of sexual and gender - based violence perpetrated against women, girls, and children in the country.

"We will begin [a] series of actions in accordance with the law to put the government's feet to the fire in combating this evil act," he said.

"The next plan of action will be announced soon. However, we call on all men to zip their trousers and join the fight against rape and other forms of SGBV against our children," Mr. Kiadii cautioned.

However, Mr. Kiadii recommended that the Government of Liberia set protocols and follow them meticulously as is done with all national public health emergencies in order to mitigate SGBV across the country.

He called on the government to increase budgetary allocations to the Women & Child Protection Section of the Liberia National Police in order to increase its capacity and adequately fund the SGBV Unit at the Ministry of Justice to enable it to respond and win sexual gender-based violence cases.

"My last recommendation, let the Government of Liberia ensure that safe homes across the country that respond to survivors are functional and supported. Increase the number of Judges in the Circuit Court E. Educate our women and families on the danger of rape to the victims' future," he appealed to government.



Network's head office in Monrovia, Mr. Kiadii lamented that it's a very saddening situation for women, children and girls to be raped and sodomized on a daily basis with the perpetrator walking with impunity.

He said the Civil Society

He continued that in 2019, a Domestic Violence Act was signed into law and the President thereafter declared Rape a National Emergency. He noted that the National Road Map was carved in collaboration with civil society organizations.

Major Human trafficking case kickoff in Zwedru



A major Human Trafficking case involving 16 persons who were allegedly trafficked to Liberia has kicked off at the 7th Judicial Circuit Court in Zwedru, Grand Gedeh County.

On October 26, 2021, the Liberia Immigration Service (LIS) with the help of the National Anti-Human Trafficking Taskforce detachment in the County arrested eight (8) Fulanis for allegedly trafficking 16 persons into Liberia from Guinea, Togo and the Ivory Coast.

According to the report, the LIS in Grand Gedeh County rescued the sixteen (16) West Africans following a tip-off, of sixteen non-Liberians being held in a local hotel in Zwedru City.

During a preliminary investigation, the Liberia

Immigration Service (LIS) in collaboration with the Labour Commissioner of Grand Gedeh, it was established that 16 persons were victims of human trafficking.

The traffickers were identified to be agents of Qnet, a criminal network engaged in the trafficking of people in the West Africa region.

According to a Labour Ministry Press Release, a team of prosecution lawyers of the National Anti-Human Trafficking Taskforce has arrived in the County to join the County Attorney of Grand Gedeh County in the prosecution of the trafficking case.

If convicted each of the eight (8) accused will get a minimum of 20 years imprisonment plus properties seized and auctioned to retribute the victims for damages and injuries

Include children surgery in healthcare delivery

-KidsOR recommends to GOL

The Director for Africa Kid's Operating Room or KidsOR, Ms. Rosemary Mugwe calls on health practitioners in the country to include children surgery in healthcare delivery, something, she says will help to minimize many treatable and health complications that children are engulfed with.

"I strongly believe that the inclusion of children's surgery in the center of health care delivery will help address the many challenges of children that are treatable", she notes.

Speaking here Wednesday, March 23, 2022 during the 62nd observance of the West African College of Surgeon annual scientific conference held at the Ministerial

Complex in Congo Town, Ms Mugwe emphasized that including children's surgery in the center of health care delivery will make service

holistic.

KidsOR is a Scottish global organization founded in 2018, currently working in West Africa to supporting local pediatrics and surgeons through training and infrastructure aimed at

ensuring they can use their talents to care for children in member countries.

In 2020, it developed an action plan to increase capacity for pediatric surgery in Sub-Saharan Africa. The exercise is expected to enable at least 750, 000 children to access lifesaving or life-changing care that would otherwise have not been available to them.

The group has created 120 centers of Excellence across Africa each with state-of-the-art Pediatrics Operating Rooms and trained 150 Pediatric Surgeons and 100 Pediatric Anesthetists, among others.

In Liberia, KidsOR is currently working with the John F. Kennedy hospital in Monrovia to help equip its surgical or operational rooms with state-of-the-art equipment.

"We are supporting countries to strengthen their health system through infrastructure equipment and health workforce development through the provision of scholarships for pediatric surgery training. Our aim is for children to access timely, affordable and quality

surgery regardless of their social and economic background."

Madam Mugwe emphasizes that every child matters, as such, no child should die or live in disability as a result of a surgically treatable condition.

"We have a project at the JFK to equip and install the state-of-the-art operating room for children with over three thousand equipment specifically, for children aimed at allowing children to have their surgical operation center", she explains.

The conference which began here on 21st March, is expected to climax today, Thursday, March 24th with surgeons from across West Africa in attendance.

The Nurse Anesthetist at the John F. Kennedy Memorial Hospital surgery room, Ama A. A. Taplah, expresses gratitude to KidsOR for their contribution to Liberia specifically, training of surgeons. "We want to appreciate KidsOR for the opportunity; they have created a compensative environment for our operation and we are also grateful for the sustainable partnership between the two institutions", Ms Taplah reveals.

Eight nations pledge to eradicate guinea worm disease

High-ranking representatives of eight countries pledged to devote all resources needed to interrupt transmission of Guinea worm disease and certify its eradication by 2030.

Democratic Republic of the Congo, and Cameroon

confirmed their commitment by signing the declaration.



Ministers and dignitaries endorsed the Abu Dhabi Declaration on the Eradication of Guinea Worm Disease to ensure the neglected tropical disease becomes the first human disease to be eradicated since smallpox in 1980. Assembling at the UAE's presidential palace, Qasr Al Watan, leaders from Chad, Ethiopia, South Sudan, Angola, Sudan, the

The Abu Dhabi Declaration was agreed upon at the conclusion of the 2022 Guinea Worm Summit, a high-level, three-day event co-hosted by The Carter Center and Reaching the Last Mile, a portfolio of global health programs working toward disease elimination that is driven by the personal commitment of His Highness Sheikh Mohamed bin Zayed Al Nahyan, Crown Prince of Abu Dhabi.

A sense of urgency surrounded this week's summit with dignitaries from formerly endemic countries and partner countries on hand to offer support to the nations where the disease remains. Donor countries and organizations also renewed their pledges to support the campaign.

In support of these countries, His Excellency Sheikh Shakhboot bin Nahyan Al Nahyan, Minister of State at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation; Jason Carter, Carter Center Board Chair; and Dr. Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus, World Health Organization Director-General, stood in solidarity. Additional support was provided by the Global Institute for Disease Elimination (GLIDE) and Pure Health.

In 2021, just 15 human cases of Guinea worm disease were reported in four countries. When The Carter Center assumed leadership of the

eradication campaign in 1986, an estimated 3.5 million cases occurred annually in 21 countries.

"Thanks to the commitment of The Carter Center and partners around the world, we have made incredible progress towards ending Guinea worm disease - but the work is not over. This week we were honored to convene global champions of the eradication effort in Abu Dhabi to renew our shared commitment towards reaching that last mile of disease eradication," said His Excellency Sheikh Shakhboot bin Nahyan Al Nahyan, Minister of State, Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation. "It is a privilege to continue the legacy of the founder of our nation, Sheikh Zayed bin Sultan Al Nahyan, who believed no one should suffer from a preventable disease. Reaching the last mile of Guinea worm disease cannot come soon enough."

In July 1990, the late Sheikh Zayed bin Sultan Al Nahyan, founding father of the UAE, invited former U.S. President Jimmy Carter to the UAE for the first time. During the meeting, President Carter described his initiative to wipe out a parasitic disease affecting millions of people across Africa and Asia. The late Sheikh Zayed responded with a substantial personal donation to The Carter Center, which established the Abu Dhabi ruling family's more than 30-year commitment to disease eradication.

Abuse of justice

The Liberian Renaissance Office Incorporated (LIROI) says prosecutors' move to suppress evidence in the trial of Alternative National Congress (ANC) political leader Alexander B. Cummings is an abuse of the role of the Judiciary, and weaponizes the courts against foremost opponents of the Weah-administration.

Mr. Cummings has denied there exists any original CPP framework agreement other than what his accusers claim is a photocopy version and has instead challenged them to produce the original. He faces charges of forgery and criminal conspiracy, but he has denied any wrongdoing.

In the wake of a prolonged internal crisis, the ALP, the

falsehood of the charges while undermining the entire basis of the trial, which was that the ANC acted "surreptitiously", and without the knowledge and consent of its partners, in the registration of the Collaborating Political Parties (CPP)," LIROI laments.

It said the local daily's independent confirmation followed similar formal complaint of prosecutorial misconduct filed before Stipendiary Magistrate Jomah Jallah by the Defense Lawyers on 18 March 2022, in which state prosecutors were accused of extracting several pieces of evidence from the WhatsApp Chatroom of the National Advisory Council (NAC) of the CPP.

"The Defense Lawyers complained that the maliciously-extracted conversations and messages by the Prosecution are crucial in establishing the innocence of, and exonerating the accused."

LIROI said it views the allegations and subsequent independent confirmation as gravely troubling.

"Suppressing evidence only to falsely impress guilt and thereby undermine the credibility of as well as exclude a political opponent from participation in the upcoming Presidential and General Elections in 2023, is undemocratic and anti-democratic," said LIROI.

"Furthermore, it abuses the role of the Judiciary, weaponizes the courts against foremost opponents of the Weah-administration, and further amplifies growing public perception that the case against Mr. Cummings' and Co-defendants, all officials of the CPP, is a political conspiracy intended to persecute, weaken and ultimately exclude Mr. Cummings and his ANC from the 2023 Elections," LIROI added.

It noted that the Presiding Magistrate of the Monrovia City Court has promised an open-ended investigation.

However, LIROI said such is the gravity of the claims on public interests, and the resultant consequences for Liberia's fledgling democracy that it calls for a speedy, independent and transparent investigation to include the National Bar Association, the Inter-religious Council, and the Press Union of Liberia.

"We urge that the findings be made public. Where it is determined that the government prosecution is engaged in the criminal extraction of evidence and the unethical suppression of pieces of evidence determined to be of exculpatory value to the defendants, it shall be our duty to call for and support the ending of the witch-hunt in order to preserve the integrity of our courts and blood, sweat and tears that ushered in our young democracy," he noted.

former ruling Unity Party (UP) and a faction of the Liberty Party (LP) loyal to Senator Nyonblee Karnga Lawrence have announced their withdrawal from the CPP.

The once formidable opposition bloc was made up of four political parties, but it has now been reduced merely to one party - Mr. Cummings' ANC and a faction of the Liberty party loyal to embattled chairman Musa Bility.

LIROI alleged in its release that State Prosecutors have been caught engaged in "prosecutorial misconduct" in the illegal and unethical extraction of evidence known to undermine their charges and exonerate the accused persons.

David Farhart ordered arrested

The magisterial court in Monrovia has ordered Liberia's pre-war Finance Minister Mr. David Farhart arrested for allegedly stealing and damaging several electronic materials belonging to one Margret Waiwor.

Mr. Farhart was dragged to the Monrovia City Court by Madam Margret Waiwor, accused of allegedly stealing and damaging her properties.

According to the writ of arrest, the electronics and other materials allegedly damaged include 150,000 pieces of movies; jackets; five pieces of Samsung & L.G. phone protectors; 1,000 pieces of DVDs; five pieces of DVD mass production machines; 2,000 pieces of movie posters and allegedly uprooted the roof of a building.

Mr. Farhart served as Liberia's Finance Minister from 1988 to 1989. He headed the Free Democratic Party (FDP) presidential ticket and contested in the 2005 presidential election won by former President Ellen Johnson-Sirleaf.

On Wednesday, 23 March 2022, he was seen on a prisoner bench at the Monrovia City Court, but he was later released after a criminal appearance bond was filed.

Magistrate Jomah Jallah had issued the arrest order containing charges of alleged theft of property, criminal mischief, menacing, harassment and disorderly

conduct against Mr. Farhart.

"You are hereby commanded to arrest the living bodies of Mr. David Farhart and bring him before this court to answer to the charges of theft of property, criminal mischief, menacing, harassment and disorderly conduct," the court said.

He stands accused of allegedly damaging Margret's electronic materials valued US\$75,914.00.

The writ revealed that between February 7 and 26, 2022, Mr. Farhart allegedly broke into the property of Margret and damaged several items there with violence.

The writ of arrest alleged that Mr. Farhart stole, took and carried away several items to include five televisions, phone protectors, 900 pieces of DVD movies; 50 production machines, five cartons of DVD Decks, eight bags of assorted clothes, and four pairs of slippers.

Additionally, it alleged that he carried away 11 pairs of sneakers, one 42 inches flat screen television, one Sony stereo set, two suitcases of clothes, and 300 pieces of bulldozers.

He allegedly took away 11 pieces of square pipes, 150 pieces of quarter rod; 24 pieces of square bar and one Bosh cutting machine, all totaling US\$75,914.00.

The writ noted that Mr. Farhart also insulted the complainant while taking away her materials, and made alleged threatening remarks to harm her.

The writ said the alleged act of the defendant is unlawful, illegal, wicked, criminal and intentional and is in violation of Section 15.5 and 14.25 of the New Penal Law of Liberia.

PYJ risks bloody nose in Nimba

Barely 19 months to Presidential and legislative elections in Liberia, an air of disappointment and frustration seemed to be brewing among the people of Nimba County over alleged neglect from their lawmakers with threats to give long-serving Senator Prince Yormie Johnosn a bloody nose at the

poll in 2023. At ground breaking ceremony recently in the county, he reminded voters that he laid down his life for the Nimba people during the Liberian civil war, so they should elect him for a third term that could crown him as the longest-serving senator of the vote-rich county with 27 years at the Liberian Senate. However, several callers on a community radio station, Hot FM

in Ganta City, Nimba say they are disappointed and frustrated in PYJ who was elected in 2005 and 2011 respectively, for his lack of leadership. According to them, since they elected Senator Johnson, he is yet to make any significant impact in their lives except creating troubles and sowing seeds of discord and disunity among Nimbaians. The callers lament that people in the county are suffering, particularly rural dwellers, including the people of Buu-Yao District, where PYJ hails from. They continue that Senator Johnson, who is also political leader of his Movement for Democracy and Reconstruction (MDR) party and Chairperson of the Nimba Legislative Caucus, has failed to provide leadership for caucus. Instead, they accuse him of causing troubles among peaceful citizens. Most of the callers call on
