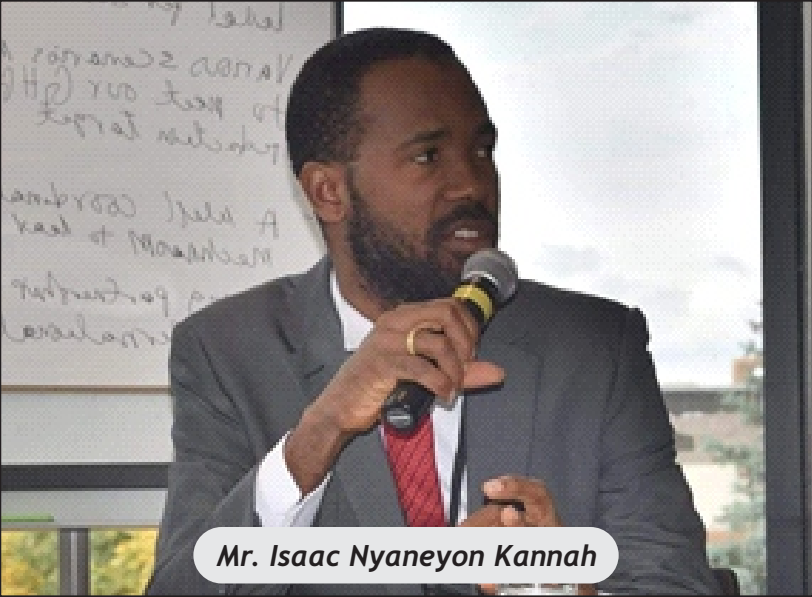

-Josephine tells Rep. Kolubah in District#10

Former commerce inspector general and ruling Coalition for Democratic Change representative aspirant for electoral district#10, Montserrado County, Josephine Davies, begins early jubilation here after winning the Coalition's ticket to contest for the district's seat.

Aspirant Davies wants to unseat incumbent opposition lawmaker Yekeh Kolubah in District#10 come October.

"To Representative Kolubah, we will not throw insult at you; if only we had done this from the start, you wouldn't have become a lawmaker, but in the soonest of time, you will pack your bags", she said.

Making remarks after winning the CDC primary, Madam Davies says she is excited to have been elected as the ruling party's representative aspirant in the pending elections.

Internal Affairs boss debunks ALCOP leader

The Minister of Internal Affairs, Varney Sirleaf, rubbishes accusations by the political leader of the All Liberian Coalition Party (ALCOP) Lusine Kamara that he (Sirleaf) is working against his (Kamara's) political ambition.

"Mr. Kamara is a Muslim; he's my kinsman. I'm not against his political ambition; instead, I'm against his refusal to allow the government to regulate the process leading to the Hajj",

Addressing a news conference over the weekend at his office in Monrovia, Minister Sirleaf he doesn't hold onto any potter, as alleged by Mr. Kamara, but if people failed to do the right thing then they resort to making false accusations.

Last week, Mr. Lusine Kamara,

action against the Grace Jet Company and whoever was involved with the cancellation of the agreement.

But responding, Minister Sirleaf says contrary to false claims by Mr. Kamara, over the past 10 years, there has been problem with the Hajj, including poor arrangements and often deliberate attempt by some Hajj agencies to deny other agencies, which triggered government's intervention.

He explains that based on the frustration and numerous complaints, poor care, and as part of a control system, the Government of Liberia decided to put in place a system to regulate agencies instead of being left along to regulate themselves.

According to the Minister, Mr. Kamara unfortunately last year, refused to honor the system introduced by the government and

who's also a former Minister of Finance during the transitional era, held a news conference and appealed to Muslims, particularly more than 40 individuals from Lofa County, who were unable to attend this year's Hajj in Mecca, Saudi Arabia because of poor travel arrangement.

According to him, the travel agency, Songhy, was untenable to send the over 40 Muslim pilgrims to Mecca this year because of cancellation of the contract with Grace Jet Company based in Saudi Arabia.

"I want to appeal to all those who couldn't make it to go for this year's Hajj through our organization. This is due to some political and personal reasons that the chairman of the hajj, Minister Varney Sirleaf has with me because I am a political leader of a party," he disclosed.

The ALCOP leader continued that he received information that it was through influence of Minister Sirleaf's that the contract was terminated with promise to refund money paid.

He said they are contemplating taking legal

instead, went ahead to use his (Kamara's) system that was allegedly characterized by money laundering and investigated by Saudi government.

He says the Government of Liberia then established a Hajj committee to regulate the process and provide a level-plain field to all agencies to recruit pilgrims, adding the government did that only because of Mr. Kamara's refusal to honor the system.

Sirleaf continues that despite all efforts by the Muslims council and the government to coordinate the Hajj affairs, Mr. Kamara was still undermining every plan, including contract signed by the team that went to Saudi Arabia, saying the ALCOP political leader began entering into separate contract outside the generally accepted contractor.

He reveals that in February this year, United Oumara and Hajj operated by Mr. Amadu Mayoubah Sheriff sponsored a team of Hajj committee comprising of the National Muslims Council that traveled to Saudi Arabia without government knowledge and signed a contract with a service provider.

The USAID's US\$1.5m grant is a significant effort

THE LAUNCH OF a grant totaling US\$1.5 million by the United States Agency for International Development (USAID) Liberia under its civil society activity for 18 Liberian Civil Society Organizations to advocate for policy reforms in health, education, and governance is both laudable and a significant intervention in the key sectors named.

THE GRANT ALSO demonstrates the Government of the United States' commitment thru her taxpayers, to, despite public sector mismanagement of several U.S. government-funded projects, continue helping the Government and people of Liberia to mitigate challenges faced in these sectors that have negatively impacted growth and development in the country.

THE PARTNERSHIP WITH Liberian CSOs further strengthens already existing historic ties between the governments and peoples of both countries that dates as far back as the 18th century.

THE DEPUTY CHIEF of mission at the United States Embassy Monrovia, Joel Maybury, who launched the program here on Tuesday, June 27, quotes President Biden as describing civil society as the lifeblood of democracy, because it comprises the collective action of ordinary people to meet citizens' needs.

THE GRANT, ACCORDING to USAID Liberia Civil Society Activity, will enable civil society organizations to advocate for improvement in education and health in six counties namely; Montserrado, Nimba, Lofa, Margibi, Bong and Grand Bassa.

THIS IS CLEARLY a strategy by the American government to directly partner with ordinary Liberians to improve their own wellbeing rather than going thru bureaucratic and sometimes conflicting or selfish priorities that don't achieve the desired results, as was reported in Kakata, Margibi county recently when U.S. government's funds earmarked for health program was allegedly misappropriated.

WE URGE CIVIL Society Organizations selected for the advocacy to execute their respective duties with utmost dedication and transparency to continuously maintain the trust of the American people, as historic partners in Liberia's forward march.

LIBERIA IS FACED with serious health and education challenges that are squarely governance issues. Well-defined strategies and programs implemented by transparent and accountable institutions could address these hindrances.

AS MR. MAYBURY noted during the launch, Civil Society Organizations benefiting from the grant played pivotal roles in shaping and leading outreach and awareness campaigns that were so essential in helping Liberia survive and overcome the worst of Ebola and COVID-19.

WE ENCOURAGE THEM to remain on this path so that expected outcomes from these sectors will be achieved with tangible impacts on the lives of ordinary people they are intended for. Doing so could attract funding for other equally challenged sectors of our public structure.

Liberia is not Sierra Leone

As Liberians prepare to head to the polls in October to retain or elect a new president and 88 Lawmakers out of 103, recent elections results filtering in from neighboring Sierra Leone appear to have given supporters of the ruling Coalition for Democratic Change (CDC) some false hope of a massive first-round victory on October 10.

These ruling party zealots believe that the Sierra Leone election results are direct reflection of the outcome of Liberia's October polls.

In what was described as a tense election, the people of Sierra Leone voted to give incumbent President Julius Maada Bio a second term on June 24.

According to Sierra Leone's Election Commission, Bio, 59, received 56.17% of total votes cast to avoid a presidential runoff against his closest rival from the All People's Congress Party (ACP).

President Maada Bio was declared winner of the June 24 polls and swiftly sworn in for a second term immediately after the result was announced on Tuesday, June 27.

The "re-election" of incumbent Maada Bio using a modified version of the Sierra Leone electoral law as it relates to the two-round system, with a candidate having to receive more than 55% of the vote in the first round to be elected has emboldened many CDCians to boost of a first-round victory.

But here's the thing-Liberia is not Sierra Leone.

Sierra Leone's politics are strongly divided on tribal lines. Although the country recorded 13 political parties' participation in its just-ended election, the two main political parties; Sierra Leone People's Party (SLPP) of Maada Bio and Samura Kamara's ACP are strongly divided on tribal lines.

For example, incumbent President Maada Bio is from Sierra Leone's second largest ethnic group Mende. According to Wikipedia, Mende makes up 31.2% of Sierra Leone's population. The Mende predominates the Southern Province and Eastern Sierra Leone (except for Kono District). They are often referred to as Southeasterners. Although, there are arguments that swing the majority number in their favor.

Meanwhile, the ACP of opposition candidate Samura Kamara is said to base its strength on the Temne ethnic group, the largest ethnic grouping in Sierra Leone. According to Wikipedia, the Temne people make up 35.5% of Sierra Leone's population. They predominate the Northern Province and the areas around Sierra Leone's capital, Freetown.

Therefore, the tension which usually marred Sierra Leone's elections is purely based on tribal sentiments.

However, unlike Sierra Leone, Liberia's politics are driven by tribal diversity. There is no political party that has its strength based on a tribal majority or minority. Why it is true that of recent, the regional card has come into play, but that is yet to have any significant bearing on Liberians' voting pattern.

This is due in part to the cross-cultural movement of political parties, with candidates seeking votes from regions considered most populated by featuring natives from those regions on their tickets and creating a crowded field. This difference makes it difficult if not impossible for a party to win an election in the first round.

Therefore, to think that the ruling party or any of the two main opposition parties-Unity Party and Collaborating Political Party (CPP) can win a first-round victory is just a figment of one's imagination.

Au total, treize nouveaux ministres font leur entrée dans la nouvelle équipe. Parmi eux, une femme, Bintou Camara, au ministère de l'Énergie et de l'Eau, ou encore Moussa Alassane Diallo, banquier chevronné, nommé ministre de l'Industrie et du Commerce.

Un représentant emblématique s'en va

Dans ce remaniement partiel, un représentant emblématique du Haut Conseil pour l'unité de l'Azawad (HCIA), principale force des mouvements armés du Nord de la région de Kidal, quitte également le gouvernement, alors que les tensions sont vives entre les deux parties.

Sierra Leone : l'opposition conteste les résultats des élections législatives

La Commission électorale de Sierra Leone a annoncé les résultats des élections législatives samedi soir, quelques heures après un communiqué cinglant du principal parti d'opposition, l'APC. Ce dernier a une fois de plus dénoncé des élections « truquées » et annoncé qu'il refuserait de participer à la gouvernance du pays. Malgré cela, l'autorité en charge de l'organisation du scrutin a donné la composition du nouveau Parlement.

C'est encadré par un important dispositif de sécurité que le président de la Commission électorale de Sierra Leone a pris la parole en fin de journée, ce samedi. Après les remerciements d'usage, il n'a fait aucun commentaire sur le rejet des résultats par l'APC. Il s'est contenté de lire longuement les résultats des élections législatives, après quoi

il a pris congé sans un mot.

Il ressort donc d'après Mohamed Kenewui Konneh que le parti au pouvoir, le SLPP, a remporté 60% des sièges du nouveau Parlement, avec 81 députés. L'APC de son côté a remporté 54 sièges. Mais l'opposition a toutefois conservé la mairie de Freetown, la capitale, puisque sa candidate Yvonne Aki-Sawyerr y a obtenu 51,36% des voix, selon la Commission électorale.

Plus tôt dans la journée, l'APC avait déclaré « sa non-participation à tout niveau de gouvernance, y compris le pouvoir législatif et les conseils locaux ».

Toutefois, Yvonne Aki-Sawyerr a annoncé qu'elle reconnaissait bien son élection comme maire de Freetown, sur la base des procès-verbaux de 85% des bureaux de vote, procès-verbaux qu'elle s'engage à présenter au public dans les 48 heures.

Cllr. Scott flags life-threatening conditions

Detailed former Liberian Chief Justice Cllr. Gloria Musu Scott has flagged prolonged pre-trial detention, lack of access to justice, deplorable, and life-threatening hygiene conditions of prison facilities in Monrovia.

Reports reaching this paper say Cllr. Scott has called for urgent help for women prisoners, especially young women inmates who lack access to justice and are facing deplorable conditions at the Monrovia Central Prison or South Beech.

Cllr. Scott and three of her family members are behind bars at South Beach Prison, a maximum prison facility in Monrovia. She has been probing into concerns of women inmates at the facility.

Former Chief Justice Scott and her family members Rebecca Youdeh Wilson, Gertrude Newton, and Alice C. Johnson are charged with murder, criminal conspiracy, and [providing] false reports to law enforcement officials.

They were charged and sent to court Thursday, 22 June 2023 after several months of police investigation

residence after the former Chief Justice reported to police authorities two separate incidents of alleged armed robbery attacks at her home in Brewerville.

According to reliable sources, the former Justice has pleaded with Female Lawyers and Human Rights groups to urgently consider providing access to justice for women behind bars.

Cllr. Scott is experiencing firsthand the plights of pre-trial detainees.

She has also asked her friends, non-governmental organizations (NGOs), and well-wishers to target efforts at improving the condition of the female wards of the South Beach prison, including repair of the windows, leakages of the roof, and supply of hygiene kits for the imprisoned women.

Cllr. Scott is said to have opined that her alleged 'wrongful detention' allows her to experience firsthand the abuse and violation of the rights of female prisoners, especially the



about the murder of Cllr. Scott's daughter Charloe Musu.

The defendants are accused of using a sharp instrument believed to be a knife to stab the late Charloe Musu.

Charloe's death in February this year shocked the country and heightened security fears.

She was murdered at Cllr. Scott's

ordeal of young women.

He is currently being treated with all expenses paid for by Jeety.
